

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

30th Sunday Ordinary Year B

Mark 10·46-52

I want to see! That sounds like what we kids would say so often as we sat in the back seat of the car. We would try to look over the front seat at something in the road ahead of us. The best seat in the back was what we called the hump seat, because you straddled the raised floor where the transmission linkage of the car ran across t floorboard, toward the rear of the car-its back wheels. If we were made to sit on the right or left seats in the back, then we could never see over the high-back head rests for the car driver or front seat passenger. But, from that middle, hump seat position, you could lean forward and lay your head down on the top of the front bench seat, and you could see perfectly over the dashboard – the best view ever! So, when we had the unlucky side seats, we would constantly cry out, "I want to see -move over- let me see!" The brother might give a little, and let us see, or might not! (Of course, if he didn't share the 'good view' when asked, that often led to more drastic tricks from us, to try and wedge in a little view over the seat-which then made the parental eyes appear in the rearview mirror advising us, "If you don't stop that fighting, you just wait until we get home!")

But Bartimaeus, has the best 'line of dialogue' in the gospel script today. His phrase, 'I want to see', should be the mantra of all seekers. We want to understand, we want to know, we want to grasp the fullest meaning possible, of reality. We want to take in the widest-angle view of everything – We want to see! St Anselm, a great teacher of our faith, defined theology as 'faith seeking understanding' (in Latin 'fides quaerens intellectum'). He wonderfully described this universal search for Truth that God planted within us, writing, "It is you, O God, that has made me, "",",", and I was created to see you, and I have not achieved yet, that for which I was made. Let me seek you in longing, let me long for you in seeking... for I believe in order to understand" (Proslogion 1).

St Anselm, (1033-1109) stands in a long line of Christian 'seekers'. Scripture is full of such admirable seekers of truth, like Bartimaeus today. These seekers do not let obstacles sidetrack them. Today's gospel says that some in the crowd tried to 'silence' Bartimaeus, trying to shut hum down and end his search. Mark 10:48 records that, "many rebuked him, telling him to be silent." But Bartimaeus becomes even more persistent. That same verse adds, that after the 'silencing attempt' against him, it says Bartimaeus "called out all the more." Some other admirable truth seekers found in the gospel are Nicodemus in John 3:2, who came to Jesus 'after hours' seeking Jesus after an otherwise full and busy schedule of duties. John 3:2 says, he came to Jesus 'at night', as if he was signing up to 'night classes'. Another seeker who had a lot working against her, but who continued to search and seek for a fuller life in touch with truth and meaning, was the woman at the well, who sought out Jesus as 'living water' (John 4:4-30). I also love the example of the leper who had followed Jesus around 'secretly' but who one day, allowed nothing to hold him back (not even his quarantining illness) and he came right up to Jesus to 'see and understand'. Mathew 8:1-4 tells us that he knew Jesus was his answer, and that to know Truth as Jesus taught it. The leper says to Jesus, "Lord, if you wish, you can make me clean." He knows Jeus possesses not only healing authority, but also teaching authority, and that Jesus could provide an explanation or account for even the role of suffering and sickness in Life. Now that is some Truth - not hiding from the unpleasant dimensions of experience found in this fallen world of ours –facing it too! The leper seeks Jesus-Truth even if it may add more suffering to his life. The leper is not deterred from facing the 'sad, but true' reality of bearing crosses in this life (like a good disciple). Yet, above all, doesn't the story of the persevering Canaanite woman teach us to pursue Truth, wherever it leads us. In Matthew 15:21-28, we hear that she is willing to joyfully undergo any insults and detraction to be assured that she meets Truth Himself. Now, that is exemplary 'seeking', to not be discouraged by any difficulty and to not let anything hold us back from seeking-meeting Jesus who is Truth itself (John 14:6). He assures us that a seeking heart will eventually overcome all obstacles and illusions, when he taught us confidently, "Seek and you will find" (Matt 7:7)! Peace, Fr Brian
