Granby Educational Building Dedication

A dedication service for the new Sunday School addition was held August 15, 1971 at the Gospel Tabernacle of Granby, Missouri. Prayer was offered by each of the five board members at the conclusion of the service conducted by F. E. Waterbury, pastor. The board consists of Melvin Shank, Houston Cook, Harvey Poe, Marvell Carman, and Jerry Patterson.

The new wing, running north and south, just east of the main Sanctuary, contains 1260 square feet and features movable partitions. They act as dividers for Sunday school rooms or can be removed entirely for a fellowship area. A kitchenette is built on one end of the new structure. The floor is carpeted and central heating and air-conditioning was installed. A "U" is now arranged by the entire church structure with the old educational wing, setting east and west, joining the new part to the Sanctuary.

We are very proud of what the Lord has allowed to come our way in this building project and invite our many friends to come and visit with us whenever possible.

EDITORIAL

We have just been in a wonderful camp meeting. The Lord met with us in every service. We heard many messages and Bible lessons inspired by the Holy Spirit. There were sermons on the Soon Return of the Lord back to earth again, Divine Healing, love and on the Holy Spirit and His workings among other subjects.

Some sermons brought out controversial ideas. Here we need to be very careful per chance bitterness or strife might enter the heart. In I Corinthians 3:1-3 Paul said, "And I brethren could not speak unto you as unto spiritual but as unto carnal even as unto babies in Christ. I have fed you with milk and not with meat: for hitherto ye were not able to bear it neither yet now are ye able."

In the third verse I want all of us to examine ourselves in the light of these words, "For ye are yet carnal, for whereas there is among you envying and strife and division, are ye not carnal, and walk as men?"

My good brothers and sisters in Christ, let us each be cautious. If we build up envy and strife in our hearts against one another we are carnal, for whereas there is among things, you may disagree with some things, but if we allow hatred in our lives, we're worse off than those who may teach a little contrary to us. Living sanctification is far more important than preaching sanctification as a new birth (which I do believe, as a new life is found in salvation just as a baby has life before birth. Then a baby is born and receives freedom to move

about as we receive freedom in Christ when our Carnal nature is cleansed. So much for my views). After all...if we all possess and live sanctification, we will all receive the new birth regardless of which way we teach it.

We heard some sermons at Camp Meeting on love. Then some will turn around and do things contrary to their teachings. The old saying, "don't do as I do but do as I say" then becomes their philosophy. If we truly love our brethern as God tells us and teaches us to love, we'll be interested in their welfare. We'll spend our time praying for them instead of talking against them. Prayer will do much more good for them and for our own personal spiritual life where as talking tears us down spiritually and does neither person

any good.

I may disagree with someone. I may feel they are way off base. What am I going to do about it? Am I going to run them down, talk about them, wish something would happen to them? We're wanting to see souls saved, we're preaching and trying to help men. We can't do this if we entertain malice in our hearts. You don't have to condone what is said or done, but you should not "blast them out of their saddle" either as another common saying goes. If I disagree with you, I had better get on my knees and pray until the Lord puts His love in my heart so that we can disagree but yet love each other. Don't let hatred and malice destroy us spiritually. This is the working of satan. He's working today and is trying in every way to destroy us and our spiritual life. Won't you join me in prayer that God will unite us all in love inspite of our differing views on the scriptures? Let God work in our hearts! I've said none of this throwing stones at any person. All I'm concerned about is that we as ministers stop our bickering and fussing between one another and start praying for one another. God can't work in our movement if this continues. I'm concerned and praying! Please agree with me as when two or three agree on any one thing, God answers prayer!

SERMON OF THE MONTH

Made One Through Sanctification

In St. John 7:16 and 17 we read, "Jesus answered and said, My doctrine is not mine but his that sent me. If any man will do his will he shall know of the doctrine whether it be of God or whether I speak of myself." Please read previous words in the chapter.

In St. John 17 he again speaks. Hear his words. "As thou hast sent me into the world, even so have I also sent them unto the world."

The word sanctification found in the Bible possibly has as many letters in it as any other that can be found. The meaning and worth wrought in we creatures of dust is as great or greater than any that can be found. Now please read St. Luke 11:2-4 and St. Matt 6:9-13.

The portion I'm desirous for you to understand in Matthew are these words, "Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven." In Luke, "Thy will be done as in heaven so in earth."

In I Thess 4:3 we read, For this is the will (the wish of the Lord) of God even our sanctification (Our dedication or surrender to him) that ye should abstain from fornication (in the flesh) also spiritual fornication (with the world's organizations of men) but brought to a place where we can posses our vessel (body in which we dwell) in sanctification and honour.

In Heb. 9:7-10 we are told Jesus came to do the Father's will by which we are sanctified through the offering of his body once for all. (By faith can't you see him upon the cross?) God so loved the world that he gave his son. St. John 3:16. Christ so loved the church (or the ones who came to God in repentance) that he might sanctify and cleanse it by the water of the word, that he might present it to himself

a glorious church not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that it should be holy and without blemish. Eph. 5:26-27.

A move in the world and has been for sometime is for all church organizations to come together and it would be wonderful if this was done in God's way. But this impossible if done only in sentiment. The tendency is to be influenced by emotions not reason...as the only thing in reality is the sanctifying power of the blood of Jesus Christ. And while the false church is in its make-up, the Lord is making his church, the bride, ready for his return.

We are warned in Isa. 8:12, 13 "Say ye not a confederacy (league or alliance) to all them to whom this people shall say a confederacy neither fear ye their face nor be afraid. Sanctify the Lord of hosts himself and let him be your fear or dread."

Now, let me ask you a question. Is it possible man can be more just than God? Why do we have so many, many different faiths or organizations of men? The answer is they know not the value of the bloodshed upon Calvary to make us One.

We are warned in Romans 16:17 with these words, "Now I beseech you brethern mark them that cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which we have learned and avoid them.

Does it mean we dislike them or are fighting their work? Absolutely not but only fulfilling the command of the Lord and will keep praying for their enlightenment.

Do we dislike sinners or anyone who refuses some portion of God's word? It only grieves us and keeps us praying with a divine love for them.

Please read Hebrews 2 and remember these words in connection with this message.

For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethern.

Now since we have been in study about the will of God and the prayer Jesus taught the disciples to pray, let us now study and treasure in our hearts the prayer of Jesus for us before ascending back to heaven. The entire 17th chapter of St. John gives a full description of his care and love. As you meditate upon it, may I ask the question, "Has it been fulfilled in your life?"

In verses 1 and 2, these words spake Jesus and lifted up his eyes to heaven and said, "Father the hour is come, glorify thy Son that thy Son also may glorify thee: As thou hast given him power over all flesh that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him."

Now it would be impossible for Jesus to have power over all flesh in the world for the most people have not come back to God in repentance. They are dead in trespasses and sin, but to the ones who have and fully surrender their lives, we read in I Thess 5:23-24, "And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly and I pray God your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. Faithful is he that calleth you who also will do it."

We read in verse 6 of John 17, "I have manifested thy name unto the men which thou gavest me out of the world: thine they were and thou gavest them me and they have kept thy word." Verse 9, "I pray for them. I pray not for the world but for them which thou hast given me for they are thine, and all mine are thine and thine are mine and I am glorified in them."

In verse 10 Jesus asked the Father to keep the ones he had given him that they might be one as we are. He tells the Father while he was with them in the world he kept them in his name, and because of them keeping his word he had given them, the world hated them...why?...because they are not of the world even as I am not of the world. And now Jesus asked the Father to keep them in the world from evil. And how is it

TEACHER'S NOTEBOOK



Object Lesson

Pleasures Of Sin

Objects to use: 4 sparklers (July 4th fireworks). Choose 4 children to hold and display same. A tall white candle, electrically lighted.

LESSON OUTLINE

These four boys and girls are each holding in their hands a sparkler. You all know what a sparkler is, don't you? Nearly everyone has one on the 4th of July. We'll let these sparklers picture 4 people who spend their lives in the pleasures of sin.

Let's light the 1st sparkler. (demonstrate) See how it sparkles and burns. Notice that the light comes from within and not from without. The sparkler is using up its own energy to produce this light. Oh! but it's burned out already. Only a charred black stick remains. And so it is with the person who spends his life in the pleasures of this world and forgets God. That person must use his own strength to go from one pleasure to another and will be used up physically before they are old.

Let's look at the second sparkler. (Light) See how it sparkles and shines...but only for a minute. The light is soon gone and it too remains a charred stick. This is the story of a young man who falls into the clutches of Satan and spends his life in nights of revelry and drinking. (draw a picture of one having fun for awhile and its turning to misery) At an early age he's sick and has spent all his money. Lives on nothing during the rest of life, wretched and poor and friendless.

3rd sparkler: (light) It too sparkles and is soon gone...representing the young man or woman setting out to make money. Their business prospers, they reach prosperity and are worth thousands of dollars perhaps and retire from business. But their life is empty. They experience no joy or peace. Their friends are friends

because of the money...not true friendship. Use Matt. 16:26 to conclude this sparkler.

4th Sparkler: Like the other 3, it burns for a short time and is gone. This tells of the young men and women who start out in life to win a name for themselves. Their one desire is to have prestige or fame. They win applause, attract attention by their ability to lead in politics, business deals, or maybe even become movie stars. But their sparkling days are soon over. Maybe their lives are cut short by death. They've had no time for God and yet their lives are empty. They're lonely and some even take their own lives to get out of their misery. (Cite examples as Marilyn Monroe and others) How sad for God could have filled their lonely hearts and given them peace.

Let's turn from these worthless sparklers to this beautiful white candle. (Present candle, electrically lighted). What a contrast! This candle receives its light from an outside source. It will continue to burn day after day. It is not dependent upon itself. It represents those who are Christians...have received Christ into their hearts and lives...they're shining for Him.

Use Dan. 12:3. This is a picture of a soul winner. What worth-while lives these people are living. Instead of coming to a worthless end, they shall shine for ever and ever. When they stand before God, their hearts will burst with joy as they present souls to Him...people they have personally led to God. Then they shall receive their reward of eternal life with God the Father. Let's make our lives count for Him and be filled with His joy and peace.

You can't expect spiritual improvement if you use yourself as a pattern.

It's not what you have in your pocket that makes you rich, it's what you have in your heart!

How Others Do It-

Attendance Chart

Make a banner from 1 yard of heavy flannel or felt. Use two 36 inch dowels, 1 at top and 1 at bottom, attaching these to the material with thumb tacks. Attach cord, twine, or yarn to top dowel to hang on wall.

Across the top make the word "present" on one side and "absent" on the other. You can print these with oil paint or print them on paper backed with flannel which will adhere to the other material. Next, print each pupil's name on paper and back with flannel.

Challenge your class to always keep their name on the present side of the chart.

You can back your names with flannel by using plastic cleaning bags between the flannel and paper. Place the flannel on the ironing board covered by a double thickness of a cleaning bag, place names on top of bag and iron until adhered. It's best to cover entire ironing area with newspaper to prevent iron from hitting plastic and sticking.

The Baptism Of The Holy Spirit

V. Is The Holy Spirit For This Age?

- A. God Instituted The Law

A. God Instituted The Law. The Lord gave the Law to Moses His servant on Mt. Sinai. From the time God gave the law until the law was fulfilled, that law never changed. If someone was taken in adultry; he was stoned in Moses day, in the day of the Kings, in Christ's day. God never varied from that plan as long as it was in effect. He never changed. The law reigned from Moses to the Crucification, nothing altered it. If you lived under the law you abided by it's rules. God does not change in a dispensation of time, to change he must change his dispensation.

Today we live in the dispensation of Grace. Grace will be in effect from Crucification until the Rapture. Heb. 13:8 says, "Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, and today, and forever." What happened on the day of Pentecost will happen today, because we are in the age of Grace. God does not change, but people continually change. From day to day, year to year people change. They find God, lose God, then many rule Him out of their lives. This is not right. You may not want to have the experience of speaking in other tongues, but you cannot deny that it is for today. For as we have stated, God does not change His dealings with people in a certain dispensation of time and we are in the time of the out pouring of the Spirit of God. People who are opening their eyes are receiving this blessed experience all around the world.

Do not let anyone that does not have the Holy Spirit in his life, tell you that it is not for this age. How would they know?

B. Who Can Receive The Bap-You may be wondering now, who can receive this Baptism? Is it for me? We read in Acts 2:17, "And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams:" Look, God said upon all flesh. None is to be denied. He is no respector of persons. The Bible says all believers Everyone who will open his heart can have the Baptism of God's Spirit if they will receive Him. Have you received the Holy Ghost since you believed?

Acts 2:39, "For the promise is unto you, and to your children and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." The scripture says the promise is unto you. God wants to give the Baptism of the Holy Spirit unto you. Unto you and to your children. This promise was to be handed down to generation after generation. Next we see, He says,

"Even as many as the Lord our God shall call." To as many as the Lord our God shall call and He is still calling men and women so this means He is still Baptizing with His Holy Spirit. Some say that only the Apostles and the early church spoke in tongues and that this ceased when they passed on, but this scripture says differently. It says that God's promise is for us today.

You may say, how do I receive the Baptism? We refer once again to Luke 11:13, "If ye then, being evil know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him?" Here we see we must ask, pray for God to give us His Spirit. Some people don't ask because they are too proud to admit that they need God. Another reason many people don't ask the Lord for the


Baptism is the fact that to receive the Baptism you have to be wholly Sanctified and people are not willing to pay this price. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit is real, the word of God is true. The Holy Spirit is for us today. If you will open your heart, God will baptize you.

C. The Attributes of The Holy Spirit. First of all, we find that the Holy Spirit gives us power. Acts 1:8 says, "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost parts of the earth." You will notice the Bible says, "you will receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you." You don't have this power before. Some today are preaching about the power of God, but do not know the power of God because they have never received the Holy Ghost. Paul said in II Timothy 3:5, "Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away." Many preachers have a form of godliness but deny God's real power. Yes, you receive power when you are Baptized with the Holy Spirit. That Power enables you to live a good clean life for God, not one that is filled with lust, envy, jealousy, and many other terrible

We are living in an age where people are falling away, they are following false teachers, they have itching ears, they are seeking super truths and are being deceived. If believers ever need someone to guide them into all truth, it is this day and hour we are living in. The Bible states that the Spirit is truth and He will teach us the truth, so then those that are filled with the Spirit and are seeking God, will not be led astray.

The next attribute we find is in I Cor. 2:14, "But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him, neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned." In order to understand God and His revelation, you must be saved. You must be Sanctified and you should receive the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speak-


MIND YOUR MIND

Our Dedication Whence?

Dearly beloved, we have a problem! What is even worse about this problem is that it grows greater each and every passing day. There is just such a great need for this problem to be solved in these troubled hours if we are to reach the world with the last message preceeding the return to this earth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Now you may ask just what this problem is and I'll have to tell you some of the ways that it shows itself. One very telling way that it shows is on the attendance boards in our churches on Sunday mornings. It seems that the attendance is down in so many of the churches proclaiming Jesus Christ. Now that would seem very easy to remedy. But you see, my beloved brothers and sisters in Christ, this is where another facet of the problem shows itself. The real vision of visitation and growth is no longer near as strong as it once was. For that reason, you can't get people to visit, and it is even harder to get them to talk and witness to some lost soul. Thus it is that where one part of this trouble could be offset so very easily, it only points out more of the problem.

Then there is another way that the problem is revealed. That is, on the board again, one can readily see that the tithes and offerings lag at times in a very real sense. Thus it is that the pastor will preach a few sermons on robbing God and go on and yet it does not seem to really get at the real root of the malaise.

Agan it seems to show itself in yet another way. How many weeks has it been since your church has seen a soul saved in the regular services? Great revivals do not start in the minds of people. They start with a deep burden in the hearts and lives of individuals who have had a desire to see souls saved and visions of a Christian renewal. Yet it seems today that try as we might, we do not see as much of the move toward salvation and subsequent spiritual growth that we so desparately need to see.

Another way that it is seen is in the attitude toward lost souls that we as individuals have. How much of a burden for lost souls do you have? Do you carry a burden for those around whom you work?

I remember so vividly, just in June, what my feelings were as I stood over the casket of a man with whom I had worked for almost a year. So many of my thoughts in the days before had been on my heart and I had yearned so to reach out to him knowing that he wasn't a Christian. Yet here I stood hoping that the things that had been said in some of the discussions that we had had, had reached into his heart so that he would reach out to Jesus in the days of his concern before his death. But it is such a sobering thought to consider things like this. Where is our burden for lost souls?

Then there is one last problem that we are going to consider here, and that is our love. Now you may ask in just what way I am going to consider this. Let us look at it from the standpoint of our love one for the other in our own churches, and also our love for all in the body of Christ.

How often are we confronted with the fact of how we are to treat those who are not affiliated with our group and may have been taught things with which we do not agree. Yet we know that they are Christians by the lives that they live. And how do we act toward our brothers and sisters within our own movement? Do we Love and care for them as we would for our own brothers and sisters of the flesh? How often have I seen things said in such a cutting and unsancitfied way that would never have crossed the lips of our Master? How often do we entertain hard thoughts and feelings because there is some things with which we do not agree. This is a problem in our midst, but it does not one whit of good just to look at a problem if we do not do something to correct it.

Let us ask ourselves, "just what is the root of these problems that we have?" Beloved, I contend to you that the thing we need to do to bring an answer is that we make anew an assessment of where we have put our real and true dedication. Our true and real problem is that we have made our dedication to everything allied with our work and have lost sight of the fact that our first dedication must be to Jesus Christ.

Now you will say that I don't believe this, but there is much evidence about to show this is true. John the Revelator saw that there would be a church with all the ways of true worship but their hearts were not warm. Today, if we see some one who has totally committed their lives unto God and have such a sincere love of Jesus and His Spirit, we often think them

strange.

You say but we have the works of the Holy Spirit within our midst. But let me ask you, how often are messages in tongues given? How often are interpretations given? And if there were to be some of the manifestations of the Spirit in our midst, many would immediately conclude that it is of the devil because we have gotten to the place that we have almost classified all manifestations as of the flesh. If someone were to shout, many would be shocked. The gifts of the Spirit, such as prophecy, discernment of the spirits, and others are not strong like they should be! But they could be if we were willing to seek Him as we should. Oh wretched people that we are!

We have such an apathy that it almost stifles us. But what must we do? Is there any hope for us in the days that lie ahead just before the coming of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ? I say yes!

Let us reassess our committment unto our Lord. Christ said in Matthew 6:33, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness: and all these things shall be added unto you."

But this says the kingdom of God, not the person of Jesus Christ. But again let us look into the Scriptures.

In Ephesians the first chapter, we read in verse 20, "which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his own right hand in the heavenly

places, far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come, and hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all".

Then in the second chapter, in verses 19-20, we read, "Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellow-citizens with the saints, and of the household of God; and are built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief corner stone;".

Then in chapter five, and verse 23, we again read, "For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church; and he is the saviour of the body."

Now as should be self evident from these verses, Christ is the center of the body which is the church which is the kingdom of God. Now what does this mean to us in the light of the reassessment that we had earlier called for? Let us again look at the problems that we have mentioned.

First, there is our own personal lives. We should depend less on ourselves and more on Him. Many of our feelings would change. Many of our thoughts might change because that suddenly we would begin to have more of the mind of Christ and less of the mind of self. We would begin to draw closer to Him because we would begin to see Him as our Master. Then we would love Him more. We would begin to desire more of His Word because it would please Him. We would desire even more the Gifts and Fruits of His Spirit because it would please Him. Our daily lives and loves and other facets of our lives would become less important and much more enjoyable because they would be be in their proper places and Jesus first in our lives - being exactly where He belongs.

Then other changes would begin to be seen. The attendance in our

churches would begin to go up because word would begin to get around that a spiritual revival was occuring. People who did not attend very well would suddenly find that on Sunday mornings, their consciences would be troubled enough to make them attend. People would suddenly begin to care enough to visit people for attendance to church. Apathy would not be a problem, but would be struck a serious blow. Loyalty to the church would not be a problem because God would take care of it and we wouldn't have to worry about it.

We wouldn't have to worry about the tithes and offerings coming in because God would see to it that more than enough for His needs in the church would come in. His work would expand.

Then we would begin to see another of our dire needs, that of seeing souls saved within our services, begin to cease to be a problem. How would this be? People would be carrying such a burden for lost souls that they would begin to touch the Throne of God. Such a strong bombardment for lost souls would shake even the hardest of hearts. We would really begin to carry a burden for the souls about us even where we work, where we shop, where we take care of business, whereever we are!

We would become so atuned to God that we would go about lifting up and encouraging souls everywhere not caring where they attend church, nor their race, nor their ways, because we have the very love of Jesus Christ within us. We would begin to love and live even as He loved and lived here on this earth and even as He would like for us to do.

Now maybe you think this paints a picture that seems on one hand very harsh, and on the other, as very rosy and not at all as practical as should be. But do we have faith enough to really cast ourselves on Him and trust Him to do this as we feel He would do if we really tried Him?

Let us be challenged to meet the enemy head to head and through our faith and love in Christ, let us completely commit and reconsecrate our whole selves to Him and Him only.

damaged by crooked thinking or sinful attitudes. "To be carnally minded is death," states Romans 8:6, "but to be spiritually minded is life and peace." In modern terms this verse says, "If you let your old nature control your mind, it will kill your happiness, your testimony, your effectiveness; but if you let the Spirit control your mind, you will have life and peace."

Don't get the idea that a "spiritually minded" teen-ager wears a shining halo, floats three feet above the ground and doesn't know the score of last Friday's game. Quite the opposite! A Christian teenager, whose mind is controlled by God through the Spirit and the Word, will be more alert, make better use of his gifts, and will have the kind of winsome personality that will attract others.

"As he thinketh...so he is," is the Bibical principle, and how true it is! The teen-ager who thinks honestly, creatively and spiritually will have a happy, balanced life.

ing in other tongues. Then and only then will God's Spirit teach you all things. The Holy Spirit will lead you into a greater fellowship with God, to a deeper knowledge of the word, and to a greater prayer life. The Holy Spirit teaches us spiritual things.

The next attribute of the Holy Spirit is the dispersing of the gifts. The Holy Spirit gives the gifts I Cor. 12:4 "Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit."

Another attribute of the Holy Spirit is Joy. Acts 13:52 "and the disciples were filled with joy, and with the Holy Ghost." Joy and the Holy Spirit come together. Everyone that receives the Baptism testifies of the greatest joy they have ever known.

The Holy Spirit is Truth. John 16:13 says, "Howbeit when He, the Spirit of Truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself; but whatsoever He shall hear, that shall He speak, and He will show you things to come."

The Holy Spirit is Edification: in I Cor. 14:4 "He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself; but he that prophesieth edifieth the church." I would like to define edification.

According to Webster's Dictionary it means, "to instruct and improve esp. by good example; to profit morally or spiritually." The amplified New Testament reads. "He who speaks in a (strange) tongue edifies and improves himself." So, if we speak in tongues according to the Bible, we improve ourselves spiritually. God says the Baptism is real, tongues are real. Who can deny it? Let God bless you, let him pour out His Spirit upon you. Receive all that is yours. Don't live below the standard that God had ordained for you. Another thought here: edification improves a person morally and spiritually, then how true the scripture in Acts 1:8, "But we shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you." A person has not received all of the gospel until he has received the Holy Spirit.

D. What Must I Do To Be Filled? I am sure that this question by now is ringing in your mind. The first step is in Acts 2:38, "Then Peter said unto them, repent and be baptized everyone of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Before a person can receive the Holy Spirit, he must be saved and consecrate his life to God. The need of the hour is for people to get right with God. When we are washed in His blood and cleansed from our sins, then we can receive the wonderful Baptism of the Holy Spirit.

The second thing for us to do to receive the Holy Spirit is to ask the Lord to Baptize us. Luke 11:13 says, "If ye then being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children: how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him." The heavenly Father wants to give us the very best of everything. Christian people are living far below what the Lord wants for us. Ephesians 2:6 tells us, "And hath raised us up together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus." We need to claim our promise in God and sit in heavenly places. Now is the time to ask God, receive all that he has for you, believe Him now. It is necessary for us to be filled with the Holy Spirit.

The third thing one must do in order to receive the Holy Spirit is to be completely dedicated and consecrated to God and His Gospel. Acts 10:2 says, speaking of Cornelius, "A devout man, and one that feared God with all his house, which gave much alms to the people, and prayed to God always." There are four things that stand out in the life of Cornelius: he was devout, he feared God, he gave alms, and he prayed to God. To be filled with the Spirit, one must be yielded to the Spirit of God. Willing and obedient to do whatever he can do to complete the will of God in his life, no matter what sacrifice it takes. When we come to this place where we say, not my will but thine be done, then we have come to the place where God can use us and fill us with His

Holy Spirit.

Where love is thin, faults are thick!


