ATTENTION: The American Red Cross is closely monitoring the Zika virus. We ask you not to donate if any Zika virus risk exposures applies to you. We are asking you to return to donate blood 4 weeks after your last risk exposure. All other eligibility requirements still apply. After you make your appointment you can pre-register and answer the health questions with rapid pass at the redcross.org site.



Dear Houghs Neck Residents,

I hope you and your family had a fun and safe July 4th. I enjoyed meeting everyone at the July 3rdEdgewater Drive Family Fun Day. The Houghs Neck Community Council coordinated another wonderful family event.

Department of Energy Resources and the Joint Committee on Telecommunications, Utilities and Energy have been discussing importance of advancing energy storage research. The ability to safely and efficiently store electricity for long periods of time, in relatively small spaces, is essential to the advancement of renewable energy generation. Currently, one of the issues with solar and wind generation is energy shortfalls during high demand times of the day and year. Various European countries have been experiencing these difficulties as a result of the fast and comprehensive expansionof solar and wind generation to the point where there is insufficient electrical generation to meet consumer demand. The committee is exploring ways to make Massachusetts a leader on energy storage research and development.

I recently met with the new CEO of Milton Hospital, Rich Fernandez. Milton Hospital is an affiliate of Beth Israel Deaconess Hospital and is part of its hospital network. This network gives Milton Hospital the ability to negotiate with insurance companies for better reimbursement rates. Milton Hospital has expanded

its services to provide more convenient services for South Shore residents, including joint replacement procedures, wellness prevention programs, and Endoscopies. Since the closing of Quincy Medical Center, there has been a significant increase in Quincy patients at Milton Hospital, especially those on MassHealth (Medicare/Medicaid). Milton Hospital is facing the same challenges that Quincy Medical Center faced along with many other community hospitals. Currently, the MassHealth reimbursement rate is between 40% and 60% for services with the remainder paid by the hospital. This is a federal reimbursement calculation, which the state cannot control. Depending on what changes Congress and the President makein regards to the Affordable Care Act, community hospitals, like Milton Hospital, may have their federal assistance and reimbursement rates affected.

Themembers of the Joint Committee on Health Care Finance toured the AstraZenecaWaltham campus in June. The Waltham location is AstraZeneca's headquarters global infectious disease research and a regional hub for oncology drug research. The site has 285,000 square feet of lab space and employs 450 employees consisting researchers, scientists and support staff. What is remarkable about this location is that it houses 10 separate companies in its research and development space called BioHub. This allows these smaller startups to access AstraZeneca's state of the art infrastructure, research equipment and devices that they otherwise would not have the capital to purchase or ability to utilize as part of their research. The concept of the BioHub removes barriers to research and increases collaboration among scientists. One example of the groundbreaking research being done at the BioHub is the advancement of microchips for cancer drug development. Microchips arepieces of technology that mimic human cells to see how certain drugs will affect cancer cells, while also determining the drugs' impact on other vital organs. This gives scientists the ability to study the impact of drugs on the human body prior to any live animal or human clinical trials. They are working to customize human cells for each individual and then test the drug on the microchip before giving it to the patient to fully study potential impacts. Biotechnology lab technicians and support staff are still in high demand and educational institutions such as College are ahead of the curve by offering biotechnology technician certifications for those seeking to enter this field.

The State House's legislative recess on formal sessions is on August 1st and formal sessions will resume after Labor Day. There will still be informal sessions, public hearings and briefings in August. In addition, from August 6th to August 9th, the National Conference of State Legislatures will be holding its annual meeting in Boston for the first time in ten years. It is expected that over 5,000 state legislators from around the United States and United States territories will be attending. As the host state, we are

working to create a positive and productive experience for visiting legislators, with sessions ranging from administration and finance, to energy production, healthcare and constituent engagement.

The Quincy Asian Resources, Inc. August Moon Festival will be on Sunday, August 20th from 12 pm to 5 pm, on Coddington Street in front of the South Shore YMCA and Quincy High School. This is a new location for this event. The City of Quincy is establishing signature events for each month and the August Moon Festival is going to be the signature event for August. In addition, the agency is led by a new CEO, Philip Chong. Philip previously worked in healthcare fundraising and education program development at Simmons College.


