Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

ARTICLE VII **Doctrine**

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherance to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. These common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows: Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers. Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 29:8-9.

Destruction of the Wicked. Conditional Immortality Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teachings approved by the Board from time to time if they are not consistent with the above listed basic doc-

Throughout the years I have had the priviledge of attending many camp meetings in Laverne and in Baxter Springs, Kansas and often hearing the first and last prayers which ascended to the throne for Gods blessings to be given

our hungry hearts.

Now for a few years my goings and comings for God in his harvest field which was told me when making my consecration in 1920 was near my home in Spearman, Texas has been different and fewer in miles traveled. Since that time my body physician from the crown of my head to the sole of my feet has been Jesus who bore the stripes for such. A very few years ago that known as a sun stroke came my way and God again in his time brought deliverance but each summer since when the sun is high in the heavens I am made to know it is time to go from its direct rays. In late March 1986 my body collapsed at age 971/2 years lacking one month and I was really in need of the help of others and this was given by children and grandchildren, the prayers of so many and after about two months my wonderful Lord restored that I could again drive the car for my needs in whatever way they may be. Generally speaking I do for myself and what grieves me most no longer am I able to do for others as I would love to as in the past. But thank the Lord I don't feel there is any retirement for the Soldiers of the Cross.

When waking on the morning of Jan. 20, 1985, I had one of the surprises of my life when I heard the still small voice of God which said – To God a note of Thanks – this is to be the heading of a Bible article to be written and published every week in the Spearman Reporter, our home newspaper. With the cooperation of the publisher Mr. Billy Miller it has and is being done. It has been a great blessing to me just to help spread the glorious news of God's love for the world and the Love of Jesus for a glorious Church without spot or wrinkle. I no longer drive my car a great distance along and I do not like to drive at night as in past years but I certainly am well acquainted with the streets that will take me to the house of prayer for all services for my blessing. In all services there is

blessing whatever way it might be.

Friends with meeting you at camp meeting this year many would seem as a stranger (but not in the Lord) and I feel I must tell you how much I miss the faces of them of past years who are asleep in Jesus. Yes and of the work required in earlier days that all be blessed in such services. Many, many tents put up for us to stay in, a large one went up as the kitchen and dining room. In this one tables (crude ones), burners of some kind and it was all done a love service no matter how great the sacrifice. Many were involved and I shall only mention; two, Ben and Jack Barker whose home was in or near Laverne.

The Lord hasn't changed, the gospel is the same. He has always had and still has faithful laborers, so now is the time for all of us to be in that number. We must stay wide awake spiritually for the Word tells us which were from the lips of Jesus Be ye ready, in such an hour as ye think not the Son of Man cometh.

Sis. Greever, 97, Spearman, Texas, continues to serve God faithfully as He leads.

HIS CALM IN MY STORM

This is the miraculous account of a lady in our church, Sis.

Adel Luckey, and her battle against cancer).

Nearly a year had passed since my mastectomy, but I never could get well. Now I sat in the doctor's office, waiting to hear his diagnosis. His shocking news came all too soon; they hadn't gotten all the cancer out from the mastectomy, and now it had spread. From my remaining breast to my liver, the cancer had spread. It was eating my red blood cells so fast that I needed two pints of blood every week or so. The doctors couldn't hardly get enough blood from my bone marrow to make a test, as the vicious disease took its toll.

All through this time, I felt such a great calm within me; God's calm in my storm. A friend of mine from the Rockdale Full Gospel Church who had also had a mastectomy, called my daughter, Joy, and asked, "Does your mother know what's happening to her? She acts too calm about this." I knew what was happening alright, but I took the time to rely on God for His strength. It was the only way I could make it

One day as I was sitting at the table, I raised my hands and began to praise the Lord. My husband asked, "Well, what brought all that on?" I knew that God had done something within me. I called my daughter, Melba, and told her that I

knew I was better.

The next day, I went back to the doctor for a blood test. The medication he had given me to treat my cancer wasn't suppose to take effect for a month to six weeks, and this was only the third week. The doctor was amazed at my progress. I was making my own red blood cells, and this time when they gave me a bone marrow test, the blood came spewing out. There was much to be thankful for.

And yet, there was still something that bothered the doctor. and me. My remaining breast was filled with nodules and a big mass. As I sat before my television one day listening to the Richard Roberts Show, I heard them begin to pray for a lady in my same condition. I knew they were praying for me. Withouta moment's hesitation, I rebuked the devil and asked

God to heal me.

The other day, I had another check up. The doctor said I am "superb". My breast is fine, and so is my health overall. I felt the need to share this testimony with you. It is my hope that anyone going through a similar battle will be strengthened by this. God can be the calm in your storm too!

I just want to thank the Lord for being alive and able to serve him. I'm thankful to be blessed with such lovely pastors as Bro. Robert and Sis. Dora Beydler in our church in Enid, Okla. How could we do without them? The Lord has been with them and us since they come. They are a present help in every time of trouble, sorrow or sickness, They know how to encourage, lift up, answer questions, help you see the light, pick the right way to go in the decisions we make. We love

The Lord has been with me in much sickness, sorrow, mental stress and hard decisions to make in the last 6 months. November 12, 1985 I fell from a bath tub and hit my head. I entered the hospital Nov. 13 to be told that my blood was too thick plus a closed valve in my heart. I had surgery in Oklahoma City on Dec. 10. All went well except the pain medicine made me sick. I was out of recovery two hours earlier than the Doctor expected even with the medicine problem. I did very well with my faithful friend Jesus beside me. I was walking the halls in 3 days and I came home on Dec. 19 and was in church on Dec. 21 with my daughter and grandson from Texas. The hard trial came, I returned for a check-up to find out I had fluid in my left lung. I went back to surgery for placement of a tube in the left lung. The pain was severe but the Lord was there all the time to help me and mine to keep our trust in him. Then came the test of my faith, courage, longsuffering, patience and understanding. I almost failed the test. The bills came like a mountain and I became low and had questions I couldn't answer. Then I realized one day at a time is all we are required to live. Yesterday was gone, today is the Lord's, tomorrow will take care of itself. I tried hard to rest in the Lord. The devil used his tools to put me down but I held on. He tried to make me believe I couldn't do my own business after the loss of a large sum of money came up – missing. The Lord has provided so it will be counted as a loss never found. The mental pain was hard but with Jesus help the victory came. My last trip to the hospital came May 14 while away from home when my heart went into failure with lung congestion in the left lung. After 6 days in the Seiling, Okla. hospital was told by my doctor that I must rest with only four hours work per day. It's hard when you've been able to go and help others whenever you want to. Resting in the Lord has helped me to be still and know that he was God. Prayer is the answer to the victory over all our trials. Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever. A decision to spend most of my time in Fairview with my husband who is ill with a breathing problem was hard because I wanted to be at my home church in Enid, but pride was put under foot. I attend a good church in the country. They treat me lovely and the fellowship of saints is sweet.

Pray that I may keep my all on the altar for his service. I want to be like Jesus so I can win souls for Jesus. God bless all you good people in the Apostolic Faith Movement.



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Cults Are False Prophets

CULT DEVIATIONS FROM MAJOR ORTHODOX DOCTRINES SYNCRETISM

Syncretism! This is the way most cults are formed...taking some ideas from a number of religions or teachings to form the new. The First Problem of anyone who would reach others for Christ is to find a way to minister the eternal truth of the Word of God in language that can move across walls of culture and prejudice. The Christian communicator must find appropriate ways to "become as" the people to whom he ministers. A Christian needs to determine the exact belief of the person heHE IS CONFRONTING AND DEMONSTRATE HIS GENUINE INTEREST IN HIM.

Within this total context, however, is a line beyond which we must NOT move. The loving concern for spiritual accommodation can be pressed to the point where it compromises the Gospel of Christ. This kind of accommodation

involves one in a grievous sin called syncretism.

Syncretism describes the attempt to gather together what some would call "the best qualities" of various religious points of view into a new and acceptable faith. The definition of syncretism from a religious point of view is the "process of growth through coalescence of different forms of faith and worship or through accretions of tenets, rights, etc. from these religious which are being supergoded."

those religions which are being superseded."
Syncretism is a FAVORITE CULTURE DEVICE. Cults incorporate older doctrines into their systems of faith along with new and creative heresies. Few cults of our time present much that is really new in the world of religion. Almost invariable they are a rehash of existing concepts, orthodox and heretical. They present warmed-over elements of Protestantism, Catholicism, paganism, pantheism, idolatry, local fetishes, and some pure idiocy.

The CULT PROMOTOR talks about Christ, the Bible, The Holy Spirit, miracles, and other elements of the Christian revelation. The UNTUTORED LISTENER is impressed, often believing this person to be a Christian who is just a little

wiser than most.

Then comes the hooker. The cult organizer subtly introduces his theological non sequitur. He may, like the Process Church, suggest that Lucifer is NOT really an enemy of God, but one of His better friends. Or...He may, like Mary Baker Eddy, suggest that personal benefit comes not from the gracious hand of God but from the proper state of mind. A SHEEP IN WOLF'S CLOTHES!

Los Angeles, is the great boiling pot of new religions. Its sacred temples, golden altars, religious sciences, midnight seances, healing potions, miraculous handkerchiefs, pyramid power, and the "spiritual gospel of relativity" all

testify to the spiritual vulnerability of this society.

The cultust glues together a bewildering array of religioius component knowing that some of these will strike a chord of response...promising the benefits of transcendental meditation, psycho-cybernetics, spiritual rationalization, and mental science. Incorporating these in the same package with a few theological terms, he is off and running with a new cult.

The cults have been syncretists for a long time...really always. Mary Baker Eddy gives an excellent example. She took beliefs from the faith healer, P.P. Quimby, a semi-spiritualist. Her imagination was triggered as to ways to merge is view with the Bible...soon developed her own version.

Worldwide Church of God picked up a few ideas from the 7th Day Adventists and tied them with British Israelism. These were added to a few extra ideas about diet, health, and the messianic leadership of Armstrong produced a new and attractive religious combination.

Syncretism can be a very subtle, creeping heresy, moving

into many unexpected places.

A Christian theologian was heard to say at a recent conference that the great need in the world today is for the message of Christianity to become "A full-orbed Gospel for the whole man". Eloquent sentences such as this sound beautiful...but they can become the open door to many a grievous heresy. When anybody's gospel becomes more "full-orbed" than the Gospel which is very carefully stated in the Word of God, that full-orbed gospel ceases to be the Gospel at all.

When the gospel gets wider, more inclusive than Paul's definition in I. Cor. 15:14...it CEASES TO BE THE GOSPEL and becomes merely a set of unattainable religious promises.

WHAT THE WORLD NEEDS TODAY IS: the faith of Jesus Christ as expressed in the changeless Scriptures of the New Testament. Heritage can become a DANGEROUS ELEMENT in the thinking of Christians because it is almost always applied to a human tradition which at best, is only partially biblical.

The youth rebellion of the 60's spawned both the Jesus

Movement and the Satan movement.

Richard Alpert...disillusioned with money, prestige, and all, he went to psychoanalysis...then into drugs...then Eastern mysticism becoming a guru...followed by spiritism. Now he's known as Baba Ram Dass.

The whole purpose of TM is to bring the meditator into contact with spirit beings. They promise you that you can get your life together without having to deal with a personal God.

In light of all this we can readily see that Christians NEED AN UNDERSTANDING OF CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE adequate to discern the difference between what the Gospel is and what the gospel implies.

Political change, physical healing, peace marching, temperance activities, clothing styles...the list is endless...are all interesting subjects for Christian discussion. THEY ARE NOT, however, to be put in the same class with the finished work of Jesus on the cross by which He takes away our sins.

Little of Christianity remains in the countries of its origin. The record seems to show that our faith has prospered best in new and pioneer situations on the cutting edge of civilization as it moved from East to West. As churches grew older, they seem to have given themselves to the spirit of accommodation while forgetting their heavenly calling.

They opted for political change, social action, and worked with sincerity to redress the grievances of the oppressed within society. Time, money, and irreplacable human energy went into these "worthy causes" and salvation from

sin...took a back seat.

Now...in country after country the gospel of Jesus was forgotten. Churches died and never knew it! The glory and the blessing of God departed and preoccupied religionists were too blind to sense that their candlestick had been removed.

Syncretism...the attempt to synchronize the gospel of Christ with a godless world, is a deadly virus from which

almost no institution recover.

WHAT SHALL WE DO?

It is surely the case that we are today seeing a spawning of satanic cults in a measure almost beyond comprehension. Some of the old cults are splitting into several new varieties, and new cults are beginning with every week that passes.

1. Understand Christian doctrine. The chief single reason for the success of the cults is the spiritual naivete on the part of many. Too many Christians are content with a SUPER-FICIAL KNOWLEDGE of the Word of God and think of themselves as being spiritually intelligent.

The Christian must give himself to a DETAILED STUDY of scripture and must understand the Bible from a doctrinal point of view. He should have VALID BIBLICAL information that answers the questions: Who is God? What is man? What is sin? What do we mean by biblical inspiration?

We live in a time when doctrine has been played down in favor of Christian experience. This is the MOST FOOLISH course imaginable because experience has little or NOTHING to do with Christian truth. Our experiences are merely human. They are the responses of our nervous system to spiritual truth or error that impinges on our minds and heart.

2. Separation from spiritual subversion. Paul states in Eph. 5:11..."Have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness." Many people ask whether they should not attend meeting of cultic religious organizations and give themselves to an extensive reading of subversive religious literature. WITH RARE EXCEPTIONS, the ANSWER IS NO...a thousand times NO

I know of 2 who did this very thing and one is now with Armstrong's Church. He was one of our ministers for a number of years...attended Bible School and maybe taught. But when he read and studied too much with the Armstrong cour-

ses...he soon joined.

The other young man is now in The Way. He was raised by a STRONG church family that never missed a service...not even Wednesday night. His granddad was one of our ministers...and he was led off by simply attending "twig"

meeting too many times.

One has only to eat a good steak to realize that the contents of a thousand garbage can are simply beneath his standards. The statement that says, "You cannot know what it is until you have tried it", is a satanic doctrine, and it is the very one that he (Satan) used to subvert Eve and bring the terrible cancer of sin into all the world.

3. Refuse profane points of view. "Refuse profane and old wive's fables." I.Tim. 4:7. The Apostle Paul was aware that the world would be filled with spiritual exhibitionists and religious lunatics who would tie up the time and energy of anyone willing to listen to them doing this for hours and days.

We live in a time in which stories come to us about pictures of Christ in the clouds, resurrections in remost jungle areas, preachers in some obscure town with a new and unheard of

doctrine...the stories are endless

Christians are enjoined NOT to give themselves to these things but rather to follow the good advice also extended to Timothy: "Give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine." (I Tim. 4:13).

The Scripture commands again and again that he must be careful, take heed, watch, remember. He is called upon to be very sober because his satanic adversary continues to go

about seeking whom he may devour. (I Peter 5:8)

4. Do not encourage cultic practitioners. The Christian is supposed to be loving in his attitude toward people, but he must also face the hard truth that many deceivers have come into the world who do NOT believe the Gospel of Jesus and are in fact enemies of the Lord. They are antiChrist. Concerning these he is admonished to be very careful and not to risk his spiritual stability by allowing himself to be deceived.

If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed; for he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds." (II John 9-11). This is the hard but the necessary course of action for one who would protect himself and his

family from spiritual danger.

5. Be willing to contend for the faith. Scripture calls upon us to earnestly contend for the faith which means of course to be willing to defend the truth of the Gospel in the face of satanic adversaries (Jude 3). We have illustrations in the Scripture that this sometimes means coming to a point of contention with friends and associates.

The true servant of Jesus Christ must be careful that his friendship with Jesus Christ is the association that is absolute. By comparison to this, all human associations are

relative.

The first principle of the universe is truth and this must be defended even at the cost of our live. The world is described as a battleground and the essential struggle on that field of conquest is the struggle between truth and untruth.

WHAT THE LORD WILL DO

I was holding a meeting some years ago in a city auditorium across the alley from the city jail. The summer nights were hot, and the windows of our building were opened wide. The prisoners could easily hear our singing, and I learned they could catch my voice if my face was turned toward those open windows. After that I faced one side of my congregation only and spoke so loudly that I knew the men behind bars could hear me.

At the close of one of the services a policeman came to the platform and laughingly placed me under temporary arrest. He said I was needed in the prison.

A little while later I was sitting beside one of the most dejected pieces of humanity I had ever seen in my life. It was nothing new for him to be a prisoner. Time and time again he had lived outside the law, and time and time again he had been placed in a prison cell.

He sat gazing pensively at the concrete floor. After looking me over he settled back into a moody, dejected silence.

At first I could not understand his refusal to speak since he had sent for me. But he was so bewildered and so torn asunder by conflicting emotions that he was afraid to try to express himself. So I opened before him the pages of the Book of a Father's love and told him the story of Calvary

He turned on me almost bitterly and said "What has Christ ever done for me?"

He asked the question, so I gave him my answer. I told him that the Lord had given him every good thing which had come to him in life. Men could manufacture clothing, but only God could grow the wool on the back of the sheep. Human hands could fashion the shoes upon the last, but only a miracle-workfing God could put the cattle on a thousand hills. Man could take his bucket to the well, but only God could put the water there.

I told him of many things the Lord had done, and when I turned to him and said: "But I want to talk to you, my friend, about what the Lord will do."

As I spoke, his eyes opened wide in wonder and amazement. I did not have time to tell half the story.

Once in a while he interrupted me, and well do I remember the question which fell from his lips: "Is it really for me, preacher? Is that really true?'

I wish you could see that man now-saved and filled with the Spirit, transformed in life and in appearance. He can sing

I asked him "Has the Lord been all to you that I promised He could be?'
