Dear Church Family and Friends,

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God...I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. <u>I have learned the secret</u> <u>of being content in any and every situation</u>, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength." Philippians 4:4-6,12-13

By the time you are reading this newsletter, we might be experiencing lovely spring or even summer like temperatures. We will be ready for whatever comes and keep our snowbrushes handy until June. Can we be ready for whatever comes in our spiritual walk? God is always with us whether we need a raincoat or sunglasses, the love of God never changes!

Pentecost Sunday is May 23, 2021


