### **“The Day Room”**

Things are ticking along nicely on our plans and preparations for our July show. There are a couple of things that I would like to emphasize early on, though.

The first is to remind everyone about how important it is that all of us remain available to help during the show. We will need all-hands, especially to help on the judging team. Those of you who judged last year know how time-consuming it is, but our contest literally cannot work without good judging. The first year that we drop the ball judging will probably be our last year.

This issue is really at the forefront of my mind right now. I've been corresponding with several national-level AMPS officers about ideas to improve the judging system and processes, and I can tell you that the success up in Auburn this year was a double-edged sword! Success breeds success, and AMPS shows grow in size and attendance year after year. As more and more model-builders begin to appreciate the value and benefit of AMPS-style judging and its 100% specific, constructive feedback, more and more model-builders want to enter their models in AMPS shows. This is no surprise to me. In my book, the "AMPS-way" is the best way to run any model contest!

However, with that growth comes the additional burden of more and more judging, and more and more judging means that more and more volunteer judges (like you and me) have to be willing to spend more time in the "judging pits." It can't be helped. This year, I expect our show to be larger than it was last year, and all of you who were involved last year know that we were maxed out on our judging capacity then. This year will be no different. It will require a 100% effort from all of us.

The second thing that I would like to stress is on a more personal note. This year I'm asking for some more help with picking up and returning the tables that we use. Last year, I had to rely on my wife, my nearly 80-year old dad, and our handicapped pastor to carry and load/un-load all of the 8-foot tables. Also, I had to scrounge around and borrow another truck and trailer to haul them along with finding another volunteer driver for it. Hopefully, this year I can get some of you to give me a hand. (My wife would really appreciate it, and so would I!)
