FROM PASTOR LEE

Memory is a powerful tool. When singing Joy to the World my mind returns to my home church, a Sunday night probably early in Advent. I wasn't aware of Advent at an early age, not that we didn't celebrate, but once the Sears and Roebuck catalogue came I didn't care about Advent candles or Christ coming again. I was focused on gifts gotten on Christmas morning.

It was a service, probably one I slept through once or twice when at the end we stood, sang Joy to the World, lit our individual candles and followed the choir down the isle (my family usually sat in the third or fifth pew) and out the doors. It was here that we were greeted each year with sidewalks lined with luminaries leading us to the rear of the church where a large juniper tree was adorned with Chrismons around twelve inches in size.

As we gathered we sang, brass instruments would play from the roof of the educational Sunday school part of the church. As a youngster I thought they were in the tree. As we sang, I dripped the melted wax from the candle onto my hand, seeing how much of the warm wax I could drip and cover my hand. It was an unspoken competition among my brothers Michael, Stephen, Daniel, and me. When my brothers got older the competition intensified.

During one of the songs a switch was thrown, maybe the pastor, maybe the trustees chair, maybe the choir director, maybe the finance chair, I'm not sure. The thrown switch caused electricity to flow to the temporary lights, causing the tree to be illuminated. It was a grand moment in the life of our church and a positive memory for

me in my preschool, elementary and older years.

It's those positive memories of my first church family that still reside with me and refresh my mind on occasion. This past weekend, this month, and throughout the year we create positive memories for preschool, elementary, and older youth. Some of those occur during choir and bell practice, Sunday school, children's time in worship, special events and ministries, Christmas parade, serving others; the list is quite exhaustive. Thank you for being a congregation where these positive memories can happen, where God's love is felt and realized, where one generation takes an interest in younger generations.

I saw our children's Christmas tree this morning coming into the office – a positive memory maker. I imagined years from now when this conifer is planted, a plaque is placed and it has grown considerably, one of our children grown in stature and knowledge of the Lord, will walk by and remember the event, the congregation, and the individuals who showed them what it means to be a Jesus follower.
