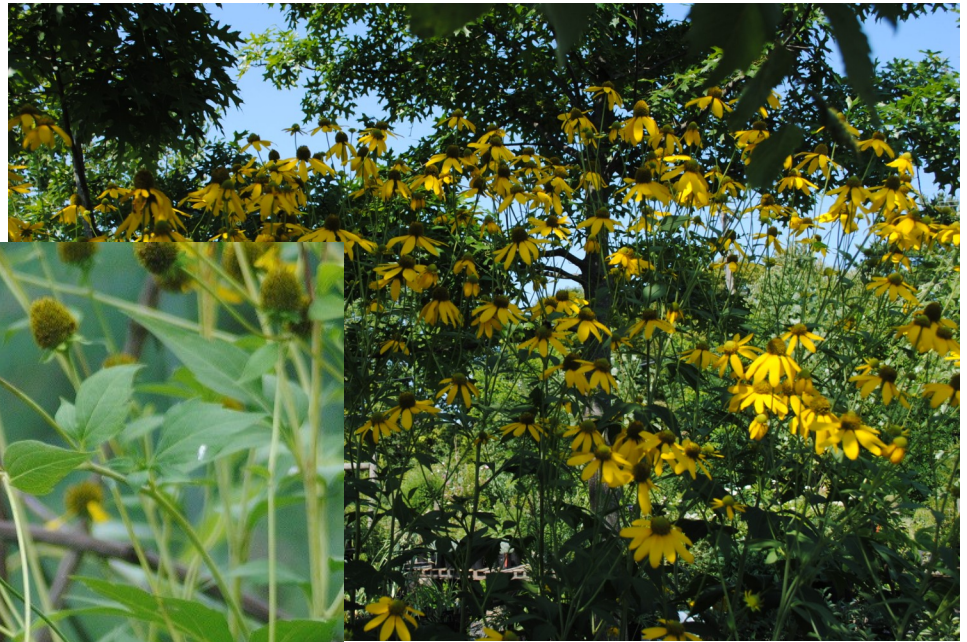


Green-Headed Coneflower



Rudbeckia laciniata

This Native perennial is a tough, aggressive plant. It will grow under just about any condition and will self seed. The Cutleaf Coneflower is a great nectar source for bees and butterflies. Birds feed on the seeds from late summer into winter. The young stems can be eaten raw or cooked. This perennial has also been used medicinally for indigestion and as a poultice for burns. The flowers can be utilized to make a green dye.

- Hardiness: Zone 4-10
- Size: 5-8'
- Flower: 3-4" yellow flowers mid to late summer
- Culture: Full sun to partial shade. Prefers moist to wet soil
- Uses: Background or middle of an island bed, border, meadow, naturalizing, wet areas, wildlife, edible, dye
