Demonstration

Jim Stottlemyer was the presenter for the night. The topic was how to heat treat steel. Then for those who wanted to make a beading tool were able to do so.

After discussing some of the ratings for steel, Jim explained the process of heat treating.

After the short class session, we set up a couple of lathes to turn tool handles, while Jim fired up the torch. Prior to the meeting Jim precut the steel to the shape needed for a beading tool. Members held their steel rod over the flame using something to hold it, (like a pair of channel-lock plyers) to start the heating process. The goal was to get the steel to a reddish/orange color. You would know when it was hot enough by placing a magnet on the heated steel and it wouldn't stick.

Then the steel was placed in oil to quench the steel, (*Jim uses peanut oil due to its high flash point*) the steel was then placed in oil that was heated to 350 degrees. It remained there for about 20 minutes, then was removed from the oil and laid out to cool. After it cooled, the steel was ready to be wiped down and put into the handle.

This was a very interesting process, and we would like to thank Jim for putting this demo together.
