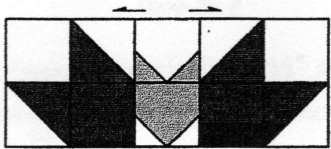
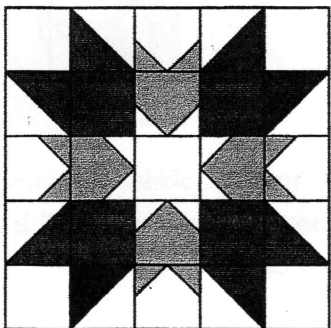
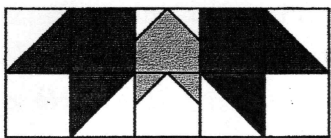
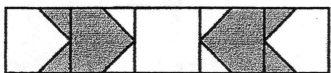
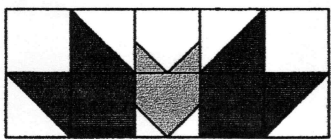


10. Join an outer-star-point unit from step 4 to each side of one of the remaining units from step 8. Make ~~eight~~<sup>2</sup>. Press the seams toward the outer-star-point units.



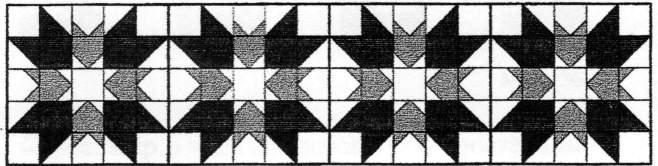

11. Sew a row from step 10 to the top and bottom edges of the center row from step 9 to complete the block. ~~Make four~~. Press the seams toward the top and bottom rows. The blocks should measure 10½" x 10½".

- ~~13.~~ Refer to "Friendship Star Blocks" on page 15 to make four Friendship Star blocks from the leftover fabrics. You should now have 32 blocks for the border.

#### ENDLESS OPTIONS

The Supernova blocks are my favorite in the "Seeing Stars Quilt." It was hard to decide what the companion project using these blocks should be. Although I settled on a one-block table topper (shown on page 67), this block would also be great as the focus of a scrappy quilt. Just make all of your blocks with different-colored star and background fabrics. You could also make three matching blocks, sew them together side by side, and add a border to create a spectacular table runner. Combine these stars with sashing or set the blocks on point for even more options!
