I was flying Tiretread Red 3. Flight leader peeled to left to attack a single we 110 with several P-47s already in his vicinity. I saw the flight leader, Major GRAY, and his wing-man, Lt STALEY, queued up to fire and I fell in behind them to take my turn in line. After Red 1 and Red 2 broke away I fired a burst of thirty rounds per gun, overshot, and peeled away to rejoin flight leader. Enemy aircraft's right engine was on fire from an attack previous to mine. I was unable to observe results of my fire as I overshot. All this action took place in a fairly steep dive with no evasive action by enemy aircraft. I make no claim.

294 rounds incendiary ammunition expended.
