Scott's
Thoughts

My Dad had a favorite scripture. I want to share it with you and then share why he enjoyed this passage so much.

Luke 15: 3-7 - Then Jesus told them this parable: "Suppose one of you has a

hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.

His reason for liking this passage was not some deep theological meaning, or the rejoicing over the "search and find" rescue mission for the lost sheep. No, what made him smile was what he added to the parable. He would look at me with a mischievous twinkle in his eye and add, "and you know what he served his neighbors at the party? "Lost Mutton Stew."

My Dad just didn't have this as a saying in his life. He lived by it. There was no saving grace for a cow that jumped the fence, or a chicken prone to wandering off the farmstead. When he found them, he called them dinner...until they were. His theory was, if they do it once they are twice as likely to do it again. Grace was in short supply for any livestock around our farm as my Dad was Judge, Jury and Executioner! He held to his belief of do it once, twice as likely to do it again, grace did NOT abound.

Thankfully for us kids, Dad's methods with livestock didn't apply to his children. We were afforded grace and my Dad would walk deep into any wilderness to bring us back. I think despite his interpretation of this passage he truly believed in his heart that grace trumps judgement. He learned this from his tremendous ability to read scripture. He read the bible every evening, normally for over an hour and when he wasn't joking about a sheep's fate, he would share with me that grace is God's greatest gift. God has had to journey into some vast wilderness places to return some of us to the fold and yet after the journey his only emotion appears to be the joy over our return. Il Peter 3:9 reminds us that God does not wish any of us perish and so he chases, begs and pleads for us to return. It isn't very dignified, but it reveals a God who despite holding all the power in the relationship, seeks to afford us every opportunity to fulfill our part of the relationship even if it makes him look weak.

Be thankful today, that you serve a God who stresses grace and forgiveness, and while you're at it...practice it a little.

God bless you all...real good.



MISSIONARY MOMENT – ROSS MINISTRY UPDATE SUMMER 2019

A REAL SUMMER

We say update "Summer 2019" – as this summer has been one quite unlike any other summer we've ever seen in Alaska. Even people who've lived here all their lives can't remember one like this. Very little rain since June, less than 2" I believe. July 4 broke all time records all over South Central Alaska. Here in Kenai it was 98 degrees F, while in Soldotna nine miles from our home, it was 103.. And here it is August, and the nice weather continues. The downfall of course is the dryness. A number of the trees around our house and in the area, including most of the Western Kenai Peninsula are being attacked by the "Spruce Beetle."

MINISTRY CONTINUES AMONG OUR ALASKAN PEOPLE

Those of you who follow our ministry closely, know that summer is a bit more 'laid back' (if I can use that phrase) than other times of the year. However, every day is a new day, and brings new and existing challenges. A number of our friends (at least three that come to mind) have suffered strokes and are in need of God's continued healing. I (Alan) am currently received physical therapy on my right arm for a partially torn rotator cuff. Other parts (like knees) need attention, but we press on.

• The **Dekenagh Det'eh** (culture nest) continues; two Thursday's evenings and two Sunday afternoons each month, with our son Jon (leading the charge) who is the CTO "Chief Tribal Officer" for **Yaghanen Ht'ana** (Salamatof Tribe), literally, "The Good Land People. Jon has a passionate heart that the Dena'ina people (and others who are interested) of this area, keep the language and culture alive. So we fully support him in this. The agenda goes like this: 'introductions' – 'honor an ancestor' – "say a Dena'ina word, along with it's meaning" or 'learning a word or phrase you want to know about' – 'break for food' (K'elqat) – 'sing and drum Dena'ina songs' – and (eventually) **Yaht'ana k'eljeshna** have our own dance group.

Our group recently participated in a "Memorial Potatch" for the late Chief Simeon Chickalusion, who saved eleven people (of 600) from "Susitna Station", a Dena'ina village, wiped out by a TB epidemic in the 1930's. These 11 people were relocated in 1934 to present day Tyonek, across Cook Inlet from Kenai.

- The **Qetna t'uh** (elder's place) called **"Tyotkas"** (a Russian word) is where the elder's gather for lunch Monday Friday. Following lunch we sing Christian and other fun songs with the people. Some stay for this and others need to leave for doctor appointments etc, at Dena'ina Wellness Center, next door. Seems we are meeting new people all the time. One lady we just met yesterday (on a 'berry picking' trip to Seldovia by boat), we found out she was from a village that Arctic Missions/InterAct Ministries started a church in over 50 years ago! and knows many missionaries who ministered there, and also Victory High School where she attended.. Small world.
- The **Native Fellowship Gatherings** took a summer break, as people leave town or are busy with other things like we are.. We plan to get that back up and running this Fall (which isn't that far away) Our gauge is the "Fireweed." When it's "topped out" that means our fall season is approaching.
- The "Hearts Going Toward Wellness" (Unuwatet Asiyaturtut Alutiiq) We recently had a gathering for some of our local people here in Kenai who've attended a HGTW. We shared a meal together, "catching up" with each other in our daily struggles and battles, then worshiped together with songs of praise, for all God is doing in our lives. We will be meeting soon with two of our leaders who have expressed interest in preparing for and planning our next conference in October.. This is a huge need, as Linda and I have often prayed that God would raise up those to take over our leadership responsibilities.
- The "LEaD Alaska" (Leadership & Discipleship) Program (of which Linda and I are board members) are doing an "Alternate Year Program." This three month (rather than the six month) residential training (October 2019, January & March 2020) will include for all who participate, the modular trainings by Fairbanks native pastor Harry Hafford, two sessions of HGTW, as well as trainings from Alaska Bible College, Healthy Boundaries in Life, Walking Our Walk & Talking Our Talk, and Bible Studies in the doctrines of our faith, and two NT book studies from 1st & 2ⁿd Peter.

Thanks for your prayers and faithfully supporting us all these years. We pray that God would bless you.

"CCC Woodworker's Projects"



Projects that the woodworkers are currently trying to implement include building Dulcimers and building shelves for the sewing room, woodworker Dan Miller is interested in building signs. The signs usually have religious wording or quotes on them and are usually scriptural. He has created some already, which you may have seen on the walls in rooms or the hallway, such as 'Coffee' by the coffee maker in the Fellowship Hall or 'Library' by the door in the hallway.

These signs may be by request such as "Welcome" or "Home is where Mom is" and can be purchased by anyone for a nominal fee of \$20.00 to help with material costs. One may donate materials (we like old or antique wood) for the project and suggest a quote to put on it or may simply donate monies for any future projects. If there is any remaining money after the finished project, it will be put toward future materials. Signs may be made for individuals for personal use and may cost more for materials or labor but only at an agreeable price. To give you an idea of price, the sign in the church Foyer with the John 3:16 scripture on it, would be \$125.00 because of the rare Cedar wood and the number of letters on it. The church or any individual will not benefit financially.

Currently the text used for the signs that are finished and now on the walls is original poetry by Donna Miller based on scripture, and artwork by Dan Miller based on her poetry. Anyone may contribute text to put on future signs for themselves or for the church. At no time will text be used that is inappropriate. When all the signs have been made and donated for the rooms in the church, any signs after this will be made by or for church members for personal use or for the church.

Dan Miller and Zoi Langreder are currently working on signs with the words for the Nursery, Fellowship Hall, Pre School, Office and Worship. Completed signs so far are Coffee, Library, Gospel, Disciple, Shepherd, John 3:16, God Is Love and Pastor. We need more volunteers to help with the artwork and sign building and we would like anyone to volunteer wording or text that we can put on the signs.
