M: Dear friends, let us approach God with a true heart and confess our sins, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to forgive us.

**Luke 22:7-20 (EHV)** 

<sup>7</sup> The day of Unleavened Bread arrived, when it was necessary to sacrifice the Passover lamb. <sup>8</sup> Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go prepare the Passover for us, so that we may eat it."

<sup>10</sup> He told them, "Just as you enter the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters. <sup>11</sup> Tell the owner of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, "Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" <sup>12</sup> He will show you a large, furnished upper room. #### WORDS OF INSTITUTION






