


2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C) Sunday 16 January 2022 Attitude of Creative Service

Most of us are familiar with today's Gospel story about the miraculous change of water into wine at a wedding party at Cana in Galilee. This was the first miracle performed by Jesus. Without any intention to minimize Jesus' power in performing this miracle, it would be a good idea to focus our reflection on Mary. Without her contribution this miracle would not have happened. Mary was not the person in charge of this wedding at Cana. In the ancient world, it was always the bride's father who was in charge. And being in charge of a wedding was not an easy task. Weddings were some of the very few occasions in ancient times when common, working-class people could take time off to celebrate and enjoy themselves. As a result, most weddings would include five to seven days of festivities. When Jesus and his newly formed band of followers showed up, they would have joined right in. And with the added drinking capacity of a bunch of hardy fishermen, it's no wonder that they ran out of wine. But the interesting thing is that the head caterer (the "headwaiter"), the one who was responsible for providing food and drink throughout the wedding festivities, was not the one who noticed that the wine was running short. Instead, it was the Blessed Virgin Mary. Even in the midst of a rollicking party, a wedding feast where she was a guest and not a hostess, she kept her attention on the needs of others. She didn't become so self-absorbed in having a good time that she forgot about those around her. Instead, she recognized the potential disaster, and then she took the initiative to do something about it - to help avert the great embarrassment and disappointment that running out of wine would cause to the bride's family. That was Mary's habitual approach to life: she always fostered an attitude of creative service. She kept her eyes open for opportunities to help others, and she took the initiative to seize those opportunities. This is how she reflected in her own day-to-day life the goodness and generosity of God, who is always thinking of us and providing for us and watching over us. An attitude of creative service is one of the keys to being a true follower of Christ. By the way, where did Mary get her inspiration and strength to follow and contribute to Jesus' mission so creatively? Well, she was filled with the Holy Spirit after the Annunciation, and from then on she dedicated her entire life to serving Jesus and contributing to his mission.

How about us? I think Mary is our perfect model of being a true follower of Jesus. Like Mary, we too have received the gift of the Holy Spirit. When we were confirmed, we formally declared our intention to spend our lives serving Jesus and contributing to his mission. But it's not always easy to carry out that noble and wise intention. Life is full of challenges, surprises, and temptations, and it's easy to get distracted. As we continue with this Mass, let's ask the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Queen of Heaven and Mother of God, to intercede on our behalf, just as she did for the newlyweds at Cana, so that even when we don't seem to have any wine left in our hearts, God's grace will still flow freely in us and through us. Let us strive to become mature Christians by imitating her

attitude of creative service, by sharing in her confidence in Jesus, and by joining her obedience to God's will. Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!

#55 UPDATE: GENERAL LITURGICAL GUIDELINES COVID-19 Implications for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne

Information Updated: 23 December 2021, 5:00pm

As of 11.59pm Wednesday 23 December 2021, the following measures will be applied to Masses at Sacred Heart Parish::

From 11:59pm Thursday 23 December 2021, face coverings will be required for gatherings indoors (except in the home) for people aged eight and over, or for those with medical exemptions.

All Catholics in Melbourne continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further directed by the Archbishop. We continue to carry the happy obligation to keep Sunday holy, whether we can attend Mass or not, and can do so by any kind of prayer with members of our household and parish, reading Holy Scripture, and encouraging one another in our faith. Prayerfully participating in online Mass continues to be a great source of comfort on Sundays.

Please do not attend Mass if you are feeling unwell, have tested positive or are waiting for a Covid test result.

Check in is still required. Thank you.


THOUGHTS FROM POPE FRANCIS

GOSPEL

John 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.'

His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water', and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
