# A MORE EXCELLENT WAY

Greetings church family,

As you have heard by now, our office administrator Rhonda Mahaney is stepping down from her role within the church to work full-time for the local OSU Extension. While this will leave Trinity with big shoes to fill and sad hearts, we are excited for her new opportunity and the impact she will make in her new venture! Having grown in friendship with Trinity for years, we look forward to her transition from administrator to simply sister in faith.

It's hard to explain how important an office administrator can be to the life of the church. Besides managing papers, agendas, bank accounts, budgets, newsletters (...who do you think sent this to you!?), and bulletins our office administrator is often the keeper of the church history, the collective knowledge and plans of multiple church councils, the heavy emotions that are shared in her office, and a whole host of secrets that I can barely fathom! It takes a special person to be an administrator. Perhaps that's why even the Bible lists administration not just a vocational gift, but a spiritual gift!

You are the body of Christ; each and every one of you is a vital member. 28 God has appointed gifts in the assembly: first emissaries, second prophets, third teachers, then miracle workers, healers, helpers, **administrators**, and then those who speak with various unknown languages. 29 Are all members gifted as emissaries? Are all gifted with prophetic utterance? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? 30 Or are all gifted in healing arts? Do all speak or interpret unknown languages? Of course not. 31 Pursue the greater gifts, and let me tell you of a more excellent way—love. – 1 Corinthians 12: 27-31 (The Voice)

Love for God and love for people is what can take a skill of administration and turn it into a spiritual act. It takes a heart for the Lord to deal with all the personalities, conflicting opinions, plans, and problems that arise in the life of the church. In this way, church administration is not just a job. It is a ministry. It is an act of worship. If the church is the community of God's people, the office administrator is often the one who keeps the house in order. If the Pastor is the shepherd, the administrator is the pen!

Jesus even uses the example of an administrator when discussing the cost of discipleship.

"28 "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? 29 For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, 30 saying, "This person began to build and wasn't able to finish.' – Luke 14: 28-30 (NIV)

Office administrators help the church finish the work the God starts within them. I know this is true for Pastor's as well! So, join me today church in thanking God for all those among us who keep the house in order, keep the trains running on time, and keep the church moving forward toward God's purpose!


