The "Achievers" (as they are known in the community) volunteer at businesses and organizations throughout the community each day to learn how to work, communicate and socialize in a real-life setting. Their mission is to enrich the lives of adults with special needs by providing opportunities and support within the community. They look beyond disabilities, focus on capabilities, and expand possibilities.

In the afternoons when the 'Achievers' are done with the day's job, the group spends time exercising and playing games or doing brain teasers. In addition, each month the Achieving Dreams team will go on a special field trip. Laura Matteis, Executive Director, said that they are currently preparing for their annual fundraiser event, *Circle of Caring*. The theme for this year is "Wild West Round-Up". Because of Covid, the event will be held virtually on 10.8.20.

The Achievers make craft items that are put into a Boutique at *Circle of Caring*. The community will be able to go online and buy the craft items made by the Achievers.

They are working on projects for the Boutique such as: tie-dye bags, clay pots with plants, decorated frames, stenciled aprons, sponge paintings and terrariums. These are just a few example of things the Achievers make.


