LSU led by QB Joe Burrow pulled off their 3rd outright upset of the season last Saturday with a 36-16 win over No. 2 Georgia as 7-point underdogs. The Tigers are 6-1 already this season and their season win total was only "7" at most Vegas sports books.

## **ATS Notables**

Utah St and Washington St are both 6-0 ATS this year while Appalachian St is 5-0 ATS. Florida and Texas A&M are both 6-1 ATS. On the other side, Louisville and Wyoming are 1-6 ATS.

Utah St and Wake Forest have seen the OVER go 5-0 in their games this year. Meanwhile the UNDER is 6-0 in North Texas games and 6-1 in Ball State games.

### **Misleading Finals**

**Virginia Tech beat North Carolina** 22-19 but NC had a 522-375 yard edge. The Tar Heels were -3 in TO's and NC up 19-14 fumbled at the VT 1-yard line on 1st and goal. The Hokies then went 18 plays/98 yards for a TD to win 22-19.

**Ohio St beat Minnesota 30-14** but the Gophers had a 178-92 rushing yard edge (Minny RB Ibrahim had 157 yards) and still easily covered despite -3 TO's. Minnesota also missed 2 FG's while the Buckeyes got a long TD pass with under 3:00 left.

**Northwestern beat Nebraska 34-31 in OT** but Nebraska led 31-21 with 5:42 left and had a 98% chance to win according to ESPN's FPI. The Wildcats got a FG and then after a Nebraska punt went 8 plays/99 yards getting a TD with :12 left to force OT where they would win it there.

UCF got a 31-30 win at Memphis last Saturday. However, Memphis had 27-18 first down and 281-165 rush yard edges. The Tigers led 30-14 late 2Q but couldn't score a single point in the second half.

Marshall QB Isaiah Green (knee) is ? for this week's game vs Florida Atlantic.

Middle Tennessee QB Brent Stockstill (lower body) is questionable for this week's game vs Charlotte.

**HOME TEAM IN CAPS** 

ARKANSAS ST 35 Georgia St 21. Georgia St comes in fresh off a bye (lost 37-20 at Troy in last game) while Arkansas St played last Tuesday. The Red Wolves were crushed at home 35-9 by Appalachian St. Arkansas St actually led 9-7 late 2Q but it was all App St from there as the Red Wolves were -3 TO's. Ark St gets right here but we're not fond of laying 2 TD's and the hook.

3★ Stanford 30 ARIZONA ST 24. Both teams come in fresh off byes. Stanford comes in losers of two straight (ND and Utah) but the Cardinal have not lost 3 straight games since 2008. In their last 5 games off 2 straight loss-es, the Cardinal are 5-0 SU/ATS with an average cover of 12 ppg. In their last game vs Utah, it was a misleading game as Stanford was -4 TO's and that the stanford was -4 TO's and the stanfo -21/2-110 \$550.00 \$500.00 \$1,050.00 Oct 15 2018 17:09:45 gives us value here. Stanford also gets back RB Bryce Love in this game and will expose an overrated ASU team.

Friday, October 19th

BOISE ST 40 Colorado St 17. Boise St is 7-0 SU all-time in the series. Last year Boise St rallied from a 52-38 deficit with under 3 minutes left and eventually won 59-52 in OT. The Broncos come in off a 31-27 win at Nevada. Boise had a 506-386 yard edge but had 4 TO's. Boise QB Rypien threw 3 INT's but did get a 100-yard IR TD. On the other side, Colorado St comes in off back-to-back conference wins. Last week, the Rams beat New Mexico 20-18 as Colorado St had 24-15 FD and 423-299 yard edges. QB Carta-Samuels threw for 311 yards and CSU got a 26-yard FG from kicker Wyatt Bryan on the final play of game to win and cover. Since 2011, Boise St is 14-32 ATS as a home favorite. Pass.

Air Force 31 UNLV 23. The Falcons are playing back-to-back road games here. Last year vs UNLV they rallied from a 27-7 halftime deficit to win 34-30. Last week vs San Diego St, the Falcons lost 21-17 as AF QB Donald Hammond was KO'd from game (he's ? here). Isaiah Sanders who was the starter at the start of the season replaced him. On the other side, UNLV was blown out for the second week in a row as Utah St led 42-7 at halftime. Clearly they are different team without QB Armani Rogers. However, since 2012 Air Force is just 4-12 ATS as a road favorite. We can't doubles here. Lean UNLV.

Saturday, October 20th

KENTUCKY 30 Vanderbilt 19. Kentucky comes in fresh off a bye. On the other side, some might say we were lucky cashing a 2★ against Vanderbilt last week. While the Gators rallied from a 21-3 deficit, UF was clearly the superior team with 31-17 FD and 576-336 yard edges but had 3 TO's that led to 17 Vandy points. Kentucky is on a 0-9 ATS run as a favorite. That has us passing here. **TEMPLE 27 Cincinnati 23.** The unbeaten Bearcats come in fresh off a bye as they have already passed their opening season win total. Meanwhile, Temple comes in off a 24-17 win at Navy. Temple had a 409-284 yard edge and QB Russo was 23 of 31 for 300 yards. Navy actually led 17-7 in the 2H and late 3Q got a TD but it was called back by a ? penalty. While Cincy comes in at No. 20 in the AP Poll, we think they're closer to an average team and the line here also reflects it with Temple slightly more than a FG favorite.

Central Florida 47 EAST CAROLINA 23. Last week ECU got blown out at home by Houston. The Pirates did have 27-18 FD and 415-406 yard edges but were -4 in TO's. ECU down 42-6, got 158 yards and 2 TD's late in 4Q. On the other side, UCF trailed Memphis 30-14 late 2Q but rallied for the win. A 4th&1 71-yard TD run by Taj McGowan was the key play. Even though it's not a great

spot we lean with the road team here.

SYRACUSE 38 North Carolina 28. The Orange come in fresh off a bye after losing in OT at Pitt a few weeks ago. There was a big line move against them in that game and there is again early money against them here (line opened -12). On the other side, North Carolina had a misleading loss to Virginia Tech as NC had a 522-375 yard edge. The Tar Heels were -3 in TO's and NC up 19-14 fumbled at the VT 1-yard line on 1st and goal. The Hokies then went 18 plays/98 yards for a TD to win 22-19. We're passing

IOWA 30 Maryland 20. Iowa is now 17-0 SU/15-1-1 ATS as a road favorite after their blowout win at Indiana last week. Speaking of blowouts, Maryland crushed Rutgers (who doesn't crush Rutgers?) 34-7 as the Terps had a 375-179 yard edge. Rutgers had 5 TO's but got a TD with under a minute left to avoid the shutout. Keep an eye on the total here as strong win is in the forecast.

DUKE 27 Virginia 20. Both teams come in off strong performances last week. Duke cashed as a 2★ on these pages as they won outright at Georgia Tech 28-14. GT's 3 fumbles turned into 3 Duke TD's all in the 3Q. On the other side, Virginia got a signature win under head coach Mendenhall as they upset Miami, FL 16-13. Could this be a bit of a letdown spot for them here? We thought we'd be liking Duke but can't lay more than a TD.

Florida Atlantic 31 MARSHALL 28. FAU comes in off a bye. The Owls are just 1-5 ATS this season but did get a cover in their last game. They're taking on a Marshall team that blew out COLL FB GAME OF THE YEAR Old Dominion last week. Marshall had a 501-402 yard edge including 319-106 on the ground 402 yard edge including 319-106 on the ground as RB King ran for 195 yards. The Wildcats pulled a shocking comeback last week as they trailed 31-21 with 5:42 left and had just a 2% chance to win according to ESPN's FPI. NW got a FG and then after a Nebraska punt went 8 plays/99 yards getting a TD with :12 left to force OT. QB Thorson was 41 of 64 for 455 yards and 3 TD's. On the other side, the Scarlet Knights have lost 6 straight and last week were blown out at Maryland. Rutgers had 5 TO's as freshman QB Artur Sitkowski was pulled late in the third quarter after going 2 for 16 for 8 yards and four interceptions. Rutgers got a TD with under a minute left to avoid the shutout. Northwestern is a 20.5-point here and that's the Wildcats largest away favorite role in modern history (since 1980). Slight lean on the home team

MASSACHUSETTS 37 Coastal Carolina 31. Massachusetts comes in fresh off a bye in what has been a disappointing season so far. Speaking of disappointments, Coastal Carolina had one last week as they were blown out at home by ULM as TD favorites. ULM only had a 466-439 yard edge and the score was 24-20 late 3Q before Coastal had 2 4Q TO's turn into 14 ULM points. Slight lean on the home team here.

ARMY 33 Miami, OH 20. Miami, OH is facing the option for the first time since 2011. The RedHawks are playing an 8th straight week while Army just came off a bye two weeks ago and hammered San Jose St 52-3 last week. Army had 23-10 FD and 395-171 yard edges including 341-36 on the ground. On the other side, Miami is off back-to-back blowout wins in MAC play as they beat Kent St 31-6. Miami had 25-14 FD and 504-274 yard edges including 295-125 on the ground. Earlier this season, Army hammered arguably the MAC's best team Buffalo 42-13. We like the Black Knights here.

Michigan 26 MICHIGAN ST 19. Since former Michigan RB Mike Hart's "Little Brother" comments, Michigan St is 10-0 ATS and 8-2 SU vs Michigan. The Spartans are also on a 17-5 ATS run as an underdog and have actually gone 12-10 SU in those games. Last week was another one of those as they beat Penn St 21-17 as 2-TD dogs. considering past history and a really low total. Pass.

Ohio St 41 PURDUE 27. Ohio St off back-to-back sub-par performances as last week they beat Minnesota 30-14 but the Gophers had a 178-92 rushing yard edge (Minny RB Ibrahim had 157 yards) and still easily covered despite -3 TO's. Minnesota also missed 2 FG's while the Buckeyes got a long TD pass with under 3:00 left. Meanwhile, Purdue hammered Illinois 46-7 as the Boilers had 29-14 FD and 611-250 yard edges. The 39-point win was the largest margin of victory against an FBS opponent, since the Boiler beat Indiana 62-10 on Nov. 22, 2008. Purdue does not have much of a home field advantage as they are 4-19 ATS as a home dog. Keep in mind, this less than a 4-hour drive for Buckeye fans and the crowd will be 60/40. However, can you trust that Buckeye defense?

Alabama 42 TENNESSEE 14. Big question here is the health of Alabama QB Tua Tagovailoa. Head coach Saban says he's fine and could've went back into the game last week vs Missouri. However, Tua didn't look right as he threw 10 incompletions in the game after only throwing 25 in the first 6 games combined. Keep in mind, he has yet to play a single snap in the 4Q all season and the Crimson Tide cruised in the second half after leading Missouri 30-10 at the break. If you bet on Alabama in the first half and bet against Alabama in the second half this season, you're 13-1 ATS. Saban has never lost to Tennessee as Alabama has 11 straight wins in the series (8-3 ATS). Saban is also 14-0 SU vs his former assistants but has failed to cover 3 straight. Tennessee got one of their biggest wins in recent memory as they snapped their 11-game SEC losing streak by upsetting Auburn. This is the largest home underdog role in modern history for the Volunteers as the previous high was +20 vs Alabama in 2012.

Eastern Michigan 27 BALL ST 24. Both teams come in off close wins last week. EMU led 28-3 at halftime but Toledo rallied. The Rockets scored a TD with :20 left but missed on the 2-point conversion. Fifteen of Eastern Michigan's last 18 games have now been decided by a touchdown or less. On the other side, Ball St trailed Central Michigan 20-7 but scored 17 4Q points including a FG with :47 left to win 24-23. It wouldn't be a EMU game unless it comes down to the wire

TOLEDO 31 Buffalo 28. Could be a preview of the MAC Title game here. Buffalo comes in off a 24-6 win over Akron as the Bulls had 20-13 FD and 435-235 yard edges. They are 6-1 for the first time since 1959. On the other side, UT trailed 28-3 at halftime at Eastern Michigan last week but rallied in the second half. The Rockets scored a TD with :20 left but missed on the 2-point conversion. We lean with the home team here.

**AKRON 29 Kent St 26.** One of our favorite MAC rivalries here as it's the Battle for the Wagon Wheel with the series tied 23-23-1. Akron has won 3 straight in the series but the Zips are off back-to-back blowout losses after losing 24-6 at Buffalo last week. Meanwhile. Kent St lost 31-6 at Miami. OH. The Golden Flashes got a 7-yard TD run with under a minute left to avoid the shutout. We lean wit the home team here.

Penn St 36 INDIANA 23. The Nittany Lions come in off back-to-back frustrating last minute losses at home to Ohio St and Michigan St. They need to take some frustration out and have vs the Hoosiers the last 3 years at 3-0 SU/ ATS with an average cover of 12 ppg. Meanwhile, Indiana is coming off a blowout loss at home to Iowa last week. Penn St is now out of the playoff picture. What's to play for?

WISCONSIN 42 Illinois 14. Obviously, Wisconsin was smashed at Michigan last week as they were dominated at the line of scrimmage as the Wolverines had a 320-183 rushing yards edge! Wisconsin QB Hornibrook threw 12 straight incompletions at one point and had 2 INT's. Illinois also was crushed last week at home to Purdue 46-7. The Boilers had 29-14 FD and 611-250 yard edges. The Badgers have dominated the series and we feel they get right here. Houston 33 NAVY 26. Meanwhile, FIU took advantage of Middle Tennessee QB Brent Stockstill getting hurt as they won 24-21 after trailing 21-13 late 3Q. We're passing.

APPALACHIAN ST 44 UL-Lafayette 20. Last week Appalachian St got a huge 35-9 win at Arkansas St. App St only had a 390-336 yard edge but were +3 in TO's. Ark St led 9-7 late 2Q, but from there it was all App St. However, it wasn't all good news as their RB Jalin Moore (440 yards) is out for the year with an ankle injury. On the other side, ULL had a school-record 759 yards and 37 first downs on offense in their 66-38 win over New Mexico St. Appalachian St has covered 9 straight games dating back to last year but you're starting to pay a point-spread tax now.

3★ ARKANSAS 35 Tulsa 24. Tulsa comes in off a heart-breaking loss vs USF last week. Tulsa was up 24-10 entering the 4Q but USF got 15 points and 214 yards on their final 3 drives. 2★ UAB 30 North Texas 26. This game could decide the CUSA West division. UAB is fresh off a blowout win over Rice which gave us an embarrassing loser on these pages. UAB had 18-9 FD and 482-186 yard edges. On the other side, North Texas is bowl eligible already after a 30-7 win over Southern Miss as they had a 457-367 yard edge. UAB is 9-0 SU/8-0-1 ATS at home since returning as a program last year. The Blazers have the No. 5 scoring D and No. 5 total D in the country and this is a "Pick-Em" game?

TULANE 33 Smu 26. Both teams come in fresh off a bye after suffering blowout road losses two weeks ago. Remember last year, Tulane lost to SMU 41-38 coming up a foot short at the goal line which cost the Green Wave a bowl bid. However, note that SMU's losses this year have come to North Texas, TCU, Michigan and UCF who have a combined 5 losses this year.

Last week Charlotte got a 40-14 win over WKU as TD underdogs. Charlotte had 28-17 FD and 448-256 yard edges including 211-42 on the ground while WKU had 3 TO's. On the other side, MTSU led FIU 21-13 late 3Q but lost 24-21 as MT threw an interception in the end zone with :34 left. We're passing for now

MISSOURI 41 Memphis 31. Last week Memphis led UCF 30-14 late 2Q but couldn't score in the 2H. Memphis had 27-18 first down and 281-165 rush yard edges. The key play was a 4th&1 71-yard TD run by UCF.
