

OUR LADY OF THE VISITATION PARISH Finance Council Annual Report – Sept 2018

The work of the Finance Council is to advise Father Dwight on the financial issues involved in the administration of our parish. We develop and propose a budget for each fiscal year and monitor our financial situation throughout the year providing the members of our parish with an annual report. Charlie Albright, Vickie Bonitz, Chris Meehan, Phyllis Nye, and Tracy Plotner are the members of the Finance Council here at Our Lady of the Visitation Parish.

In this weekend's bulletin you will find a detailed report on the income and expenditures for the full fiscal year that ended this past June 30th.

Thank you for your continued support for our parish. Your donations to the parish totaled over \$288,000 which includes a \$9,000 refund from the Bishop's Lenten Appeal. An additional \$25,000 was given to the various second collections. Giving decreased by \$45,000 over what you gave last fiscal year requiring us to withdraw funds from savings to cover needed repairs to the HVAC system in the Parish Hall. Our building is over fifty years old and will continue to need additional work.

The parish continued to maintain its goal of keeping all controllable expenses as low as possible and we owe our thanks to Father Dwight and the parish staff for their hard work in this regard.

In closing, we want to once again thank you on behalf of Father Dwight and all the members of the Finance Council for your continued support and restate our policy to be responsible stewards of the donations you make to Our Lady of the Visitation Parish.
