#### A Message from Marie Leafblad.....

Hello to my Burke family, I hope this finds you well.

Last week Monday, I met with your elected leadership, council and call committee to discuss where we're at with call process and transition. For some, the news of Pastor Julie resigning her time with you all was saddening and confusing so I found this meeting to be of utmost importance to allow a safe place for our leaders to share, to grieve, and let one another know where they are all at.

To start our evening, I provided a reading from **Romans 12:9-18** 

9Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; 10 love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. 11 Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. 12 Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. 13 Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. 14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. 15 Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. 16 Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. 17 Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. 18 If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.

The letters of Paul, for all of the wonderful theology they bear, are often pastoral in nature. Paul writes to congregations he has started and to folks he has never met. He writes to encourage, to inspire, and, at times, to call God's people to task for the ways they are treating one another and the community around them. The reading from Romans gives an aspirational list of the ways Christians are to conduct themselves in community with one another and with the world. It is not an easy list by any stretch of the imagination. But, if you

hold in your imagination a place or space where people live this way, practically tripping over one another to extend hospitality and to live peaceably with all — what a gorgeous vision of Christian community Paul has created indeed.

I invite you to read the passage again, pay attention to what inspires you, and what challenges you. Consider how you and this congregation can live into the Apostle Paul's vision of Christian community.

There is indeed good community here. You are a family unit, with a family unit it sometimes means we struggle, we bicker, we gossip, we complain, we nit-pick...it's natural. It's human. I have so enjoyed getting to know your Council and your Call Committee through this process-I know it hasn't been the easiest but we are trusting that God is at work. The Spirit working through us, among us. We hold fast to the goodness we find in God, a goodness that fills us overflows out into the world around us.

On October 16<sup>th</sup>, I am looking forward to worshipping with you all and then hosting a meeting afterwards to discuss portions of the ministry site profile. It'll help give a glimpse into how you see yourselves, what you are truly looking for in a pastor and what you are truly looking for in yourselves as you think about ministry at Burke. My prayer for you is that you allow God to give you courage to listen for the Spirit as we engage in this work together.
