Well, finally it looks like spring has arrived. Yippee! After being in Florida for a couple of





August 11, 1919 - March 26, 2017

Age 97, Joseph was born in Linwood, MI the son of Nelson and Emma (Jasman) Seyuin. Joseph was a boxer in Linwood and was known as "Lightening Joe" and would have become a professional boxer,



having earned his Golden Gloves, but chose to begin working in Detroit at Goddard & Goddard Tool Company. While working at Goddard & Goddard, Joseph was introduced to the daughter of his Foreman, Gatha Edgerly. Joseph and Gatha had a very brief courtship and were married February 7, 1942. They were married 72 years when Gatha passed away on August 25, 2014. Joseph served in the United States Navy during World War II on board the U.S.S. Wisconsin. He was a 50 year member of the Groves-Walker American Legion Post 346 in Farmington. He is survived by his children, Joann Schlicht and Joseph (Mary) Seyuin; 16 grandchildren, 21 great grandchildren, 14 great great grandchildren; and sister, Anna Jodway. Collection of war letters preserves our past

April 6, 2017 marked the 100th anniversary of America's entry into World War I. In commemoration we mention a special initiative to save America's war letters by historian Andy Carroll. The project is called the Center for American War Letters (CAWL) and is located at Chapman University in Orange California. The collection now holds

approximately 100,000 wartime correspondences - from hand written letters penned during the American Revolution to emails from Iraq and Afghan--istan. Andy and CAWL are kicking off an ambitious "Million Letters Campaign." Andy will travel nationwide speaking at public libraries, museums, places of worship, military



academies, American Legion Posts and more to explain the importance of these correspondences and encourage people to share their own war-related letters and emails. If you know of someone who has war letters, please share this information so that the stories and voices of the men and women who have sacrificed so much for our nation can be preserved. 




