ATSSA BY-LAWS

<u>Privacy Policy - New:</u> In keeping with our ongoing effort to update our association, the ATSSA has approved for adoption a formal Privacy Policy to be incorporated into the by-laws, to be effective January 1, 2012:-

The policy, quite a lengthy document, covers the restricted use and confidentiality of the records the ATSSA has on file on members. Information such as: name, company, addresses, phone numbers. The policy is a 'live' document residing on ATSSA web sites: www.atssa.org and www.torontoats.com.

Responsibility for up-dating and monitoring to ensure that all executive members and committees are in compliance, will reside with the Vice President of the ATSSA.

<u>Membership Category - New:</u> Repeat. The ATSSA has approved a new membership category to be incorporated into the by-laws, to be effective January 1, 2012:-

<u>Junior Regular member</u>: "Shall be a member in transition to becoming a Regular member, who holds a valid commercial vehicle trade certificate and is directly involved in the repair and maintenance of commercial vehicles in a commercial fleet environment. This member shall not have voting privileges and cannot run for the positions of: President, Vice President, Treasurer, or Secretary." *An apprentice, in summary*.

TRAINING - C.A.R.S. (Read "Trucks"!)

CARS Council Project Manager, Linda Brown, made a presentation at our last ATSSA Executive Meeting, in a review of their expansion into training for the **truck sector**, which should be of general interest.

<u>Canadian Automotive Repair & Service (CARS)</u> new online training program 'Trucks OnDemand Technical Courses', is focused on raising the skill level of fleet maintenance staff. Registered staff can log on to <u>www.trucksondemand.ca</u> from a shop or home computer 24/7. Courses are 2 hours

long and each video is accompanied by a Learning Guide and short tests at the end. This training is easy to access, convenient and permits the technician to follow at their own individual pace. Example of a Special cost, per location: \$50.00 per month, for 12 months, for a max of 10 staff.

CARS is based in Ottawa and funded by the Government of Canada's Sector Council Program, and for advisory support is looking to the ATSSA as an accredited fleet maintenance and skill training provider.

TRAINING - HIGH SCHOOL TRUCKING PROGRAM

Complementary to its Specialist High Skills Major in Transportation, <u>Bramalea Secondary School</u> is offering a new Motive Power Truck & Coach program, housed in its own state-of-the-art facility, to



commence September 2012. The facility will be comprised of drive-through bays, an open "lab" area for modular experiential learning displays, and two computer-equipped classrooms.

This unique educational opportunity allows students from all educational pathways to gain a combination of theory and lab experience as well as hands-on work in a variety of truck and coach manufacturer vehicles and system components. While introducing students to various aspects of the transportation industry, the

curriculum provides training in Level 1 of the Apprenticeship Training Program Standards for Truck & Coach Technician. Participants will have opportunity to participate in the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program with experiential learning as well as to gain industry standard safety certification through SHSM. While obtaining a secondary school graduation diploma, students will network with industry partners including advanced educational training facilities, manufacturers, dealerships, and community businesses – all of whom can provide opportunities for training certification / employment in a high-skills, high-demand career.
