Town of Dix Board Meeting July 8th, 2024

Supervisor Smith called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Additions to Agenda - none

Public Be Heard-per policy – Mr. Avery inquired about the situation regarding the Village relinquishing the Dix water system. Nothing more to report, still trying to work things out. He also asked about the 4.5 million dollar grant the Village received. The Town was not involved and the Supervisor doesn't know what was involved. Mr. Avery requested a copy of the map of who has water and an email with talking points, he is just trying to help. Scott Burnside – also commented on the Village's grant – where is the application?

Reports:

- a. Supervisors spent the bulk of his time working on the water/sewer issue. audit for w/s district \$4000.00. The Schuyler County Humane Society is looking for \$20,000.00 for next year, by law we have to provide animal control. They took in 77 dogs from Dix since 2020. Villages don't contribute. The Town Supervisors will be getting together to discuss the issue. Beers trimmed trees on County Road 17 around the water tank. Also worked on Civil Service issues. Worked with Highway Superintendent on the bridge on Cronk Road and worked on finalizing the Pro-Housing Application form.

Superintendent of Highway oil and stoned Pearl Street and Hedden Road; Shared service work with Reading, Hector and NYS DOT; started second round of mowing, trimming over the road side tree limbs throughout the town; hauled in 7 loads of waste salt; contacted NYSEG on removal and reinstallation of pole in our right-of-way next to road side, they removed and moved pole back out of our right-of-way; notified NYS Bridge inspector on Cronk Road bridge, will be done sometime in July. Just keep plugging away. For Water/Sewer installed a cap on a lateral on Wedgewood Road, contacted several businesses for a rental generator for pump house, helped locate sewer lateral hook up for land owner on SR 414 and CR 17, contracted for 5 trees to be removed at the CR 17 pump house with Beers Tree Service off of County Bid list.
- e. Code Officer 47 total permits issued since last report; 36 building permits of all types now open; 1 demolition permit issued for a house; many building permit inspections

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completed; 2 tent permits, 4 fireworks permits; 3 violation notices issued; total fees collected \$24,164.50. Still dealing with 2 unlawful structures-no progress being made on either issue; WGI has completed the new ticket and administration building; DuVall Road Solar project has started clearing the property to ready the grounds for installation; Beaver Dams Solar project is slowly moving along, had a problem with pile driving.

Resolve to authorize the clerk to credit the sewer portion of Account #A050 an amount equal to the overage of an average bill. Ayes -4, nays -0

RESOLUTION #73 – offered by Moore, seconded by Ervay

Resolve to create a "Municipal Worker Classification" job description through Civil Service that will be all encompassing. The Town is not looking to advertise at this time but need to be prepared in case we have to take over the water sewer system. It allows for a major amount of flexibility. Once things are operating properly the water system should only require 2 to 2 ½ hours a day, so the position can be utilized elsewhere. Rural water came in and this was their idea to help pare down the budget. A Class C water license will be needed. Salary schedule will have to be decided at a later date. Ayes – 4, nays - 0
