

“The Lord helps me...and I know that I shall not be put to shame.”

In many churches around the world today, people will hear the story of Jesus’ final entry into Jerusalem and they will then be invited to take their palms and process into or around the church waving those palms and singing “Hosanna!” The invitation is usually met with varying degrees of enthusiasm and for many there is an awkward discomfort about it all. Some who feel it is just too weird, opt to stay in their pews and observe from a safe distance. Well, if it feels a bit awkward – guess what – it is supposed to!

This ritual is just a small version of the faith journey we will be experiencing in the week ahead of Holy Week. Unlike the people who cheered and sang out at the time of Jesus’ triumphant entry into the city, our present-day discomfort comes, in part, from knowing what comes next in the story of Jesus. We know that in a very short time, “Hosanna!” will turn into “Crucify him!” Knowing what is to come within the same liturgy has many of us feeling slightly hypocritical and this isn’t a comfortable feeling.

The procession, however, is also a tangible way to acknowledge our own faith journey. The story of the cheering crowds who soon become the belligerent mobs, reminds us of the ups and downs of our own attempts to be followers of Jesus. At some point in our lives, we have been one or all of the characters in the scripture story. We have been the “Hosanna” people when life was going well, our sense of God’s presence was strong and our efforts to do the will of God were filled with positive hope and promise. We have at times been the curious bystanders who watched as an opportunity to do what Jesus asked of us was presented, but we decided to sit back and blend in with the silent majority; perhaps because it required too much effort or we didn’t see it as “our problem.” Many may have felt the sting of betrayal, of prejudiced and false accusations and wished it would all go away. Many of us have seen loved ones suffer through the pain and injustice of events beyond their control and wondered, “Where are you God?” We have all had moments when fear and doubt overwhelmed our intentions to the right thing. We have all acted in ways that hurt others, sometimes irreparably, and wished we could undo it all.

So, yes, the invitation to process as a community of faith while waving palms and singing “Hosanna!” just before hearing the passion story may feel awkward, but it is an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the responsibility and consequences of being disciples of Christ. It is also an acknowledgement of how God’s grace and generosity transforms all of our imperfect attempts to do his will, into new hope and new beginnings. We walk this short, little journey today, as a sign that we will keep trying to live as Jesus taught us: to live in hope when fear and doubt threaten to overwhelm us, to return hate and blame with forgiveness and to love unconditionally. When we feel we have failed in our attempts, we will place our brokenness and shame into God’s loving hands so that we may be made whole and new again and sing from the heart, “Hosanna!”

LIGHTS AT EASTER VIGIL

When you attend the Easter Vigil this year you will notice a change in the liturgy. In the past we have only turned on the lights in the church after the 7th reading from the

Hebrew scriptures was proclaimed. This year, in keeping with the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, we will be turning on the lights as we begin to sing the Exsultet. In other words, immediately after the Paschal Candle is put in place. We do this with the thought that in Christ there is no darkness. Also, we affirm that Christ illuminates all of salvation history and not just the New Testament parts.

Chrism Mass



The **MASS OF CHRISM** is one of the most solemn and significant liturgies of our church. During the Mass, our Archbishop will bless the oil of catechumens, the oil of the sick, and consecrate the oil of chrism. This Mass also acknowledges the ministry of priests who renew their commitment of service. The Mass of Chrism gathers the faithful of the diocese with their shepherd to prepare for celebrations of Christ in all our churches throughout the year. The **BILINGUAL CHRISM MASS** will be held at Cathédral Notre-Dame-de-l'Assomption, St. George Street on Tuesday, April 16th at 7:00 p.m. **Welcome to all.**

THE WAY OF THE CROSS will be celebrated at Holy Family on Friday, April 19th at 6:30 p.m.

St.Lawrence O'Toole will **RECITE THE ROSARY** before Sunday liturgies during Lent at 8:30 a.m.



The Easter Triduum is one liturgy celebrated over three days. The three days – sundown on Thursday to sundown on Sunday – together are the culmination of the Church's liturgical year. It is often called the Christian Passover. The Triduum, the most sacred celebration of our Church year, invites us to remember all that God has done and continues to do for us through Jesus' life, death and resurrection.

Mass of the Lord's Supper Thursday, April 18th – St. Augustine's 7:00 p.m.

During this liturgy, the beginning of the Sacred Triduum, we remember Jesus' giving of himself and his example of service. In this evening's collection, you are invited to deposit your Lenten Coin Folders. Following Communion, the Blessed Sacrament will be transferred to a chapel in the church basement which will remain open until 10:00 p.m. for private prayer. The stripping of the altar will take place following the liturgy.

Good Friday Service for Children April 19th– St. Augustine's 10:30 a.m.

During this celebration adapted especially for children, we will follow the Way of the Cross, tracing Jesus' steps along the road to Calvary. At each station we pause to reflect, and pray for Jesus' support and help in our lives.

Celebration of the Lord's Passion Friday, April 19th– 3:00 p.m

Good Friday is the only day of the year on which the celebration of mass is not permitted. Today we enter and leave the church in silence.

St. Augustine's 3:00 p.m.

Easter Vigil for our Parish Unit Saturday, April 20th– St. Augustine's 8:00 p.m.

This is the highest holy day of the Christian year when the Church of God watches with lamps burning brightly, like faithful servants, waiting for the Master's return. On this night, we will light the new fire, hear the stories of God's creation and covenant, gather round the font and renew the promises of our baptism, and finally, celebrate the sign of our communion with one another in the Eucharist.

Easter Sunday, April 21st

Mass will be celebrated as usual at 9:00 a.m. at St. Lawrence O'Toole and 11:00 a.m. at St. Augustine's, as well as Our Lady of Mercy at 9:00 a.m.

NOTE: Good Friday is a universal day of fast and abstinence. On Saturday, we are invited to observe the Paschal Fast in union with our candidates. Friday and Saturday are not days of idle entertainment, shopping, party-going, etc. These are days to wait – to keep vigil – for the first feast of Easter.
