2. Do not <u>exercise</u> the authority over the vulnerable.



Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. 26 Not so with you.



"Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be the sons of your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:44-45)








Back to the Means of Grace
