THE MINISTER'S MESSAGE

The month of October is commonly noted for Halloween, which in recent years has become America's number one fun holiday. It's the only time you can go house to house and collect candy. But it is mostly known for its connection with ancient superstitions about evil spirits, witches and ghosts. Some people call it fright night. Television is dominated by horror movies, and lots of folks visit haunted houses simply because they love to be scared out of their wits.



Halloween is actually a blend of at least three ancient festivals: The Roman festival of Pomona (goddess of harvest); the Celtic feast of Samhain (the end of summer and the beginning of the dark months) when the Druids lit fires to ward off spirits); and the early Christian celebration called All Saint's Day, which follows on November 1. The name Halloween means Holy Evening, the last fling of evil spirits before the saints are honored. So, all this has been blended together into a giant pumpkin pie, mostly fun but with roots in ancient superstition. And a lot of people in our own culture really believe in ghosts, demons, and witchcraft, and therefore see Halloween celebration as a dangerous flirtation with Satan.

However, most Americans, and I would think most Christians, see in Halloween a celebration of enlightenment and freedom from superstition and fear. James Tolle writes "No enemy of mankind has caused more misery and unhappiness than fear. It cripples constructive effort; it prompts cowardly actions and words; it produces confused and frantic minds; it causes restless and sleepless nights; it paralyzes the will, destroys inner unity, upsets physical health, and shortens lives. Fear is first, last and always a curse and blight on mankind." My understanding of the principles of Christian faith includes a confidence in relationship that supersedes all dangers and assuages all fears. We believe that Jesus Christ has conquered sin and death, and he has chained all the forces of darkness. There are many dangers in life, and genuine physical safety is tenuous at best. But there is no power that can separate us from the love of God (Romans 8) nor rob us of our spiritual life. Therefore we have no reason to fear. Someone has said that courage is simply fear that has prayed. Psalm 23 is famous, and brings comfort any time we read it. Most of all the words: "Even though I walk through valley of shadow of death, I will fear no evil." Enjoy the season, and be not afraid.

SEPTEMBER BOARD MEETING SYNOPSIS

- The minutes were approved from the August board meeting.
- Mike Rippy presented the Financial Report. In August, the church paid insurance which we pay quarterly, so that is a larger expense. We gave \$200 to the Weston Fire Department.
- Kimberly Tisserand received the permit from the city and will get the two signs ordered. Texas Aerographics is the company we will order from.
- Daniel Tisserand went to AT&T and changed over our land line to be a land line including wireless hot spot. The name is FCCWeston and the password is fccweston. Cost was \$260 total for equipment. \$60 plus \$16.50 in taxes have been paid and the rest will be on our monthly bills.
- Our 13th Annual Chili Cook Off will be held on Sunday, October 27, 2019. Everyone invite friends and family. If weather • permits, we will have it outside under the tabernacle. The children will participate in a costume parade and each child will be given a goody bag. Categories will be Best Traditional (red base chili with no beans), Best Non-Traditional (anything else) and People's Choice.
- We need to form a search committee consisting of 3-5 people from the church. A suggestion was made by Clark Neill to change in the constitution, Article 4, to read 3-5 people instead of 3 people. Les Massey has some people who might be interested.
- Larry Lambert visited with Mr. Hayes who owns the 8 acres of land across the road from the church. Mr. Hayes said that he is interested in selling and he would let us know cost.
- Scooter Cave has two contacts for handyman/remodeling and will contact them for quotes for work at the church. Possible ideas are painting of the fellowship hall, remodeling the kitchen, storage for table and chairs, etc. Andy Dimock will also contact Jason Miller for quotes as well.
- Next meeting will be October 6, 2019 at 9:30 am.

HYMN OF THE MONTH - "HE HIDETH MY SOUL"

Fanny Crosby (1820-1915) was Blind from six weeks old because of a surgical mishap. She could not see with her natural eyes, but she could see with her heart. She could not explain what a human face looked like, but she knew the face of God. She supported herself as a teacher at a blind school, she had dear and close friends around the world, and she wrote and published thousands of beautiful hymns, many that are still sung today. Regarding her plight in life she wrote the following words:

"It seemed intended by the blessed providence of God that I should be blind all my life, and I thank Him for the dispensation. If perfect earthly sight were offered me tomorrow I would not accept it. I might not have sung hymns to the praise of God if I had been distracted by the beautiful and interesting things about me."

For those who have natural sight, but are blind to the things of God, Fanny Crosby's songs bring a sense of His Presence.
