

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on the Monday evening after the third Sunday of the month.

Holy Name Society: Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Joseph Chimenti

BECOME MORE AWARE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT'S EFFECT



The Chosen People were quick to forget how far they had come. Again and again they grumbled as they journeyed to the Promised Land. They cried out to Moses when backed up against the sea, they complained of hunger in the desert, they turned to a golden calf when Moses spent too long on the mountaintop. In today's first reading Moses has to remind them of all the wonders God has done for them. He recalled the ten plagues, their deliverance from cap-

tivity, God's voice as they gathered at the foot of Mt. Sinai. No matter how dramatic the event, over time the memory fades and we forget how life-changing it was at the time. And yet our lives have been changed. God's effect on our life may not seem to have been of biblical proportions, but our experience of deliverance from the captivity of addiction, or of comfort after a loss or of God's voice when we are lost is no less real. And no less life-changing. With two words in today's Gospel passage we are reminded that the disciples are still struggling to accept the miracle of the Resurrection. In Matthew's account, Thomas was not the sole doubter." Matthew writes, referring to all eleven remaining apostles (Matthew 28:17). But Jesus does not express disappointment or criticism. No, He gives them the "Great Commission": the instruction to go to every nation, baptizing, teaching, and making disciples. Doubt is natural and can always be overcome. The apostles may have felt abandoned, but now Jesus assures them of His presence always. As we accept the Great Commission as well, we can be assured that we are never alone. In the first chapter of His Gospel, Matthew reveals that the angel who visited Joseph declared that Mary's Son would be called Emmanuel, "God is with us" (Matthew 1:23). Today we hear Matthew and his Gospel with Jesus' promise: "I am with you always" (28:20). God is still with us and always will be. The Holy Spirit, given to His disciples at Pentecost, given to each of us at baptism, assures us of god's constant presence with us.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

When have I noticed the Spirit's presence in my life? How can I become more aware of the Spirit's effect on me?
