From the Desk of our Administrator

(Sr. Sue Zemgulis, OP)

Let's talk about grass...the kind in your yard! I've been focusing a lot on grass lately. Our construction project has gone very well. The drainage seems to be working as it should, and all seem pleased with places to park. But...we had a whole lot of dirt in need of grass, and any of you who have had to grow grass in the middle of the summer know that it is not an easy task...particularly the watering!

As the ground was hydro seeded, it made me think of the parable of the seed, where some falls on the path where it gets trod upon, some falls on the rocky ground (or the brick wall of the building) where it cannot take root, and some falls on good soil where it can grow. But without water, it will wither and die, or simply bake in the sun. It gave me a very vivid picture of Jesus' parable asking us to reflect on the Word of God. Where do we sow God's love and mercy? How is it received? How do we care for what we sow and what is sown in us? Do we water and nurture that faith that has been planted in our hearts?

And have you ever noticed, that in the psalms, references to time are often compared to the grass that withers and fades? Psalm 103 tells us, "*As for mortals, their days are like grass; they flourish like a flower of the field; for the wind passes over it, and it is gone, and its place knows it no more.*" Watering grass takes time, and reminds me that I too need to take time in prayer, in the beauty of creation,

with those I care about, in order to flourish during my lifetime here on this Earth of ours.

Psalm 90 says, "*You sweep them [thousands of years] away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers.*" Yup, I know that feeling! You give that grass a good drink early in the morning and it looks all perky, and then the sun comes out during the day, causing it to dry and wither! Have you ever felt like that? You start your morning full of energy and as your day unfolds, certain events and circumstances cause you to wither – your energy fades. But Psalm 147 reminds us that "*God covers the heavens with clouds, prepares the rain for the earth, makes grass grow on the hills.*" It is God who sends the refreshing rains, waters the seeds of our faith. As we take time in prayer throughout each day to nurture our relationship with our God, may we come to know God's eternal love and mercy...which *never* fades or withers!

So next time you come on retreat, check out the grass – some of it is lush, some of it is patchy, some of it got washed away. How does it remind you of the grass of your life?

Two Unique Prayer Opportunities: Taize Prayer and Voice of the Grove Drum

Taize Prayer refers to *Sung Vespers in the Spirit of Taize*.



This prayer experience is offered monthly and comes to us from the ecumenical community of Taize in France. This community was founded by Brother Roger Schütz in 1940 as a place that encourages reconciliation and tolerance of all faiths. The style of sung prayer is incredibly simple and meditative. Using various chants from Taize as well as other liturgical psalm settings, we will experience Vespers in song, scripture and silence.

Thursdays: Oct. 13, Nov. 17 and Dec. 1 7:00-8:00 PM

Voice of the Grove Drum refers to an evening presentation by a community of drummers and singers from the Capital Region, who are full blood or of partly Native heritage or who follow the Native way of living, join together at pow wows and other gatherings and drum on a large 32" mother drum while singing and playing Native songs.



They drum for our Creator, for others and themselves. They drum to pray and to give thanks to our Creator for their life and all of life. They drum for others so that the Native way might be better understood and appreciated. They experience their drum beat as the very heartbeat of Mother Earth. (*free will offering*)

We don’t have Samantha but we do have Ceil. Ceil has started new business endeavors, helped close businesses, moved and downsized family and friends.

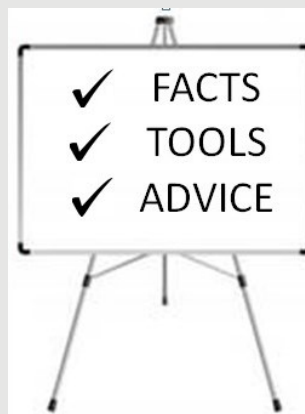

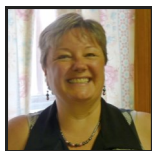

The gift of Dominican Retreat and Conference Center is that there are many opportunities to “quit playing God;” many opportunities to “Let Go and Let God.” Offered specifically for people in Recovery are our weekend for **Women Concerned with Alcoholism, Oct. 14-16** and our **Evening of Gratitude, Nov. 15.**

Margaret Maniaci is the director for our weekend for **Women concerned with Alcoholism.** Margaret has been with us before and she brings a great deal of personal and professional experience with her. Margaret has over 40 years of continuous sobriety, she is a Licensed Clinical Addictions Counselor and she has experience offering retreats. She has chosen the theme: *Awake and Walk with the God of your Understanding.* Margaret describes the weekend in this way, “Using AA approved literature, other resources and personal experiences, we will spend our time together to explore the Higher Power of our understanding and how we can improve our relationship with this Power”.

Our annual **Evening of Gratitude** is an Evening of Reflection for Men and Women. We begin with a lovely dinner, hear a presentation and have opportunity for questions/comments. This year **Sonya Boesse** will be our presenter. Sonya has chosen the theme: *Power of Gratitude.* It is Sonya's belief that gratitude adds power to our lives and that practicing gratitude is a powerful process. She believes that in a state of gratitude we have the ability to shift the mind and transform a person and any situation.

Also of interest, offered on Tuesday evening October 25, is a presentation entitled: “Responsible Gambling and Understanding Problem Gambling.” This presentation is open to all.

Enjoy the gift of time, come on a weekend retreat.

If you have never had the opportunity to make a weekend retreat perhaps now is the time. over the years and it has become quiet popular. The retreat includes lectures and meditations with questions for reflection followed by time for prayer and journaling. There is also opportunity for small group sharing.

Dates: November 18-20

Men can enjoy reflecting on the theme *Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? (1 Cor. 3:16).* The director for the theme retreat for men is **Fr. Dan Dwyer, OFM.** Dan teaches History at Siena College. He has a very varied background as is shown by his membership in both the Friends of Albany Rural Cemetery and also the Mormon History Association.



Finally, there is a weekend for both **men and women** that is popular. The draw of this retreat is silence. This retreat is our Advent Silent Weekend. Day Programs

Claudia Gregoire, OPA has a great gift for photography and for encouraging people to take time to “smell the roses”. On Columbus Day, **Monday, October 10**, Claudia will encourage us to enjoy our time and our surroundings and to do whatever is creative for us as we move through a day of *Contemplative Creativity*.

Our **Senior Day** is on **Wednesday October 12**, the theme is *Spiritual Remedies and Prescriptions for the Soul* and our presenter is **Fr. Tom Berardi**. We are happy to welcome Fr. Tom back.

In his description of the day, Father raises two questions:
*As a senior, is there a remedy for feeling better spiritually?
Is there a Rx for talking to God and being happy?*

During this day we will look at some rituals, prayers, symbols and antidotes, for spiritual healing and growth. There will also be a presentation and an explanation of several spiritual traditions of prayer, laughter and finding something new each day (*a prescription*) to celebrate.


Our **Thanksgiving Day of Reflection** is on **Tuesday, November 8**, Election Day. **Fr. Workshop for Men & Women: Pray and Paint

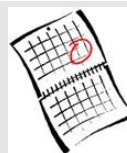
