Beatrice Buschlen, 84, of Elkton, a retired teacher, died Wednesday, May 20, 1998, at the home of her nephew, James, in Romulus.

She was born July 6, 1913, in Bay Port, daughter of the late Morris and Rachel (Bechler) Hamather.

She was united in marriage to Mervin Buschlen at Niagara Falls, N.Y., in the mid-40s, and lived and worked in Flint until the early '50s, when they moved to his farm south of Elkton. He preceded her in death

Mrs. Buschlen taught school in the rural schools in Huron County including Chandler No. 5 before her marriage. In 1953 she went to work as a cook at the Elkton School and later returned to school herself. Upon her return, she taught at Elkton Elementary, retiring in 1973.

She was a life member of the Order of Eastern Star, Elkton.

Surviving are her brother-in-law, Earl Buschlen of Elkton; three nieces, Dorothy Morin of Tampa, Fla., Gloria Jean Pickering of Tatom, N.M., and Shirley Hamather of Detroit; two nephews, Fred
