



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,



"It will be in the last place you look?" Of course, Captain Obvious! Somebody may helpfully tell us that when we are desperately looking for something that we have lost! They have to be right, because I will stop looking when I have found it- the last, but successful place looked. But people also mean by that advice, that we may be over-looking what we've lost because we assume it can it possibly be there (like when we say, 'Oh my truck keys cannot be in the truck, because I'd never leave them there" - except THAT time!) Maybe protecting my ego/pride, I shoot down the possibility that I'd lose them there.

I think this experience is similar to what is happening with today's gospel reading. Jesus reflects it in His proverb: "A prophet is not honored, in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house" (Mark 6:4) Jesus is saying that we most often overlook what is nearest to us! Or what we need most is right under our noses, but is missed. We play out a version of this unnecessary searching, when we look for a pencil, that is pushed behind our ears, or can't find reader glasses that are up on my head, or the flash drive that is bundled amidst a handful of papers in my hand. I'm not making this up, but I really saw the clip, on Funniest Home Videos, of the person whining to a friend on their phone about not being able to find 'same phone' - they had been told to check a particular text msg while already on the line, & they began walking the room looking for their flat cell phone on the tables - all while on phone!

One of Aesop's fables, the Lion & the Fox, concluded with the moral "Familiarity breeds contempt". The fable goes that a fox ends up being killed by a lion, because the fox forgot the dangers of lions, growing closer and closer to a lion by underestimating its risk. Aesop says the fox grew cool toward the lion and it resulted in him going completely cold – a dead fox! So Jesus alerts us to not overlook or grow cold to wise prophecy in our midst (maybe this happens with bias of ageism when our prejudice either writes off the older generation-'what do they know', **OR** the younger generation-'what do they know'). Specifically, Jesus is warning us not to overlook Him in our lives/world (the grace of God that is in our path everyday, but we miss it).

One trap that leads us to overlook grace & miss Jesus, is our human tendency to 'extrematize(!)' differences, instead of wisely holding them in proper balance. For example, it is easy (or lazy of us) to just remain stuck in our prejudicial status quo, 'locked in' bias of 'either/or' and 'black/white' tendency when we approach or assess something new. It is harder, but so much more fruitful to keep in mind the subtle gradations of reality (the true detailed approximation of what is up). Introducing an adjustment or incorporating some novelty does not mean a complete overhaul of what already was in place (I understand that this subtlety is what Jesus had in mind when He said, "I did not come to abolish the Law, but to fulfill the Law" (Matthew 5:17) Here's an example: Often we imagine Jesus' rejection in His hometown to be wholesale, meaning the whole town turned Him away and put Him out. Even though Jesus ultimately gets tossed from town, Mark 6:2 tells us that "many who heard him were astonished", and there were pockets enough of faith in Him among the village so that He could still "cure a few sick people by laying his hands on them" (Mk 6:5). There were open believers there, just not a critical mass of them yet! So we don't want to be just as 'closed-minded' as much of His hometown was in rejecting Him. The same can be seen how we always write off the entire 'Pharisee' group as all 'hypocritical'. There were 'Jesus-believing' Pharisees. St Paul himself identifies as a 'Pharisee' in Philippians 3:5, and Acts 15:5 tells us about some members in the early church, who were from the "party of the Pharisees who had become believers". Also, a Pharisee by the name of Simon (Luke 7:36) took such great interest in Jesus, that he welcomed Jesus into his home. And there is the Pharisee Nicodemus who was close to Jesus (John 3 ff, & 19:39). So, as a whole group, we ought not write off the Pharisees as 'them' or 'one of those kind' because of our prejudicial labels. Jesus warns us not to be misled by labels, or to allow our 'hometown' bias to lead us to miss out on the grace of God. We do not want to 'reject' God's grace or overlook Jesus when he approaches. So, we should cultivate a more deliberate and discerning heart toward greater openness to the work/presence of God among us! Peace, Fr Brian
