Holstein Steers were steady in the high 80s and low 90s on the finished cattle. We had a couple exceptional groups of colored cattle and the market was a little stronger with several from \$1.20 to \$1.25. The cow market was better as well with a lot of cows selling in the high 50s and low 60s. This was as good of a cow market as we've had for quite some time. Let's hope it continues.
