Trustees Corner

Q's & A's about our new building

In this edition of The Trustees Corner, we will talk about questions and answers surrounding the move to our new building.

On April 20, Gil Hussmann of Abbey Road Group gave a presentation on the current status of the move to the new location. We would like to share a synopsis of the question and answer session.

Question: There seems to be a bit of lack of coordination for volunteers

Answer: Be sure to monitor Facebook. The volunteer times and days are subject to change due to changes in needs and availability of the building.

Question: Will the cost of drinks and food increase in the new building?

Answer: Most likely yes. As everyone knows, the cost of all things are going up. Food and booze are not immune from this. Even with an increase, you will still be getting an exceptional value for your money.

Question: How many bathrooms in the new building?

Answer: Six stalls for both men and women

Question: At the end of the move and construction will we be debt free?

Answer: Yes, the budgets and costs are tracking to a zero debt end.

Question: Will we be able to keep the sign?

Answer: Due to city regulations, we cannot put a pole sign up. There will be a small monument sign and two flag poles.

The final question deals with when we will be officially moved into the new building. Due to delays in permitting and other issues, we have successfully negotiated with Sound Transit to extend our lease by two months, making the official "be out" date August 31. This extension will allow several things to occur: We will be able to have a smoother transition, and insure all things are complete.

We will be able to host the Grand Worthy President to help christen our new building

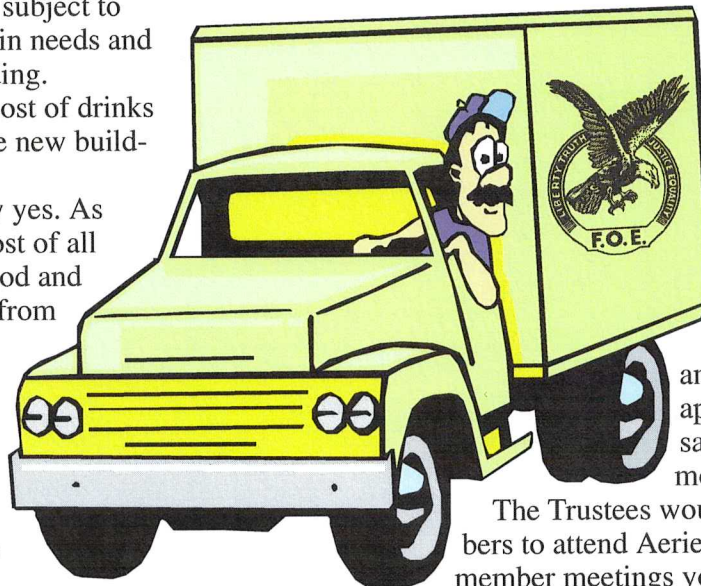
Most importantly, we will be able to have one more year of the car show! There will be more details and dates about this annual event forthcoming. Start polishing that chrome now!

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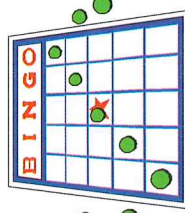
