From the Pastoral Associate: It is hunting season. While I do not hunt with a gun, I have done a lot of hunting with a camera trying to capture the ever-elusive Blue Heron, red fox, or albino buck. There is something about just sitting down and being still and waiting and waiting and being stiller still, blending in and watching. We get to see things we may not have noticed before. In the soft breeze (that is hopefully blowing toward us) we get closer to the peace and calm of nature, of God in nature. God gives us this peace and calm to give us a faint foretaste in our soul of what awaits us if we remain in God's Spirit.
