## Of Turkey Feathers and Little Pumpkins, by Mike Moran



I don't know why we continue to do it, but we let Karla Hillberg choose the course of fire for the Paul Bunyan Plainsmen's Turkey Shoot. It happened last year, too; but Mother Nature intervened with a rain storm to keep Karla in check. This year the weather was great so we were on our own and got the full Karla experience.

Being the week before Thanksgiving, and having frozen turkeys as prizes, there was naturally a Thanksgiving theme to the match. Even the scorecard had pilgrims on it. Our first paper target was a couple of turkeys, set at 25 yards, and shot with 5 shots. The second paper target was a pilgrim with an ax chasing a turkey, again at 25 yards and again with 5 shots. Not too difficult it would seem, but the target rings were pretty small, and you lost all 5 shots if you hit the pilgrim. The turkey hunters in the group would argue that those conditions were pretty realistic.

Now for the fun. At 15 yards there were two novelty shoots. The first was a pumpkin, or more correctly a gourd of some kind, no bigger than an orange. You had one chance to hit the pumpkin. The next shot was at a row of turkey feathers stuck upright in a board. Now just to make sure there was no "exaggerated eye balling" going on, Karla stipulated that a hit would only be counted if you hit the spine of the feather. Again, there was only one shot to hit the target (and again the turkey hunters would say that was realistic). Ten points were awarded per shot, giving a max score of 120 for the match.

The paper targets were set and the shooting began. There was a mid-shoot pause called to reset the pumpkin and fix some targets, but the match progressed well. When it was over, there were a lot of smashed pumpkins, but those turkey feathers remained untouched. At the prize table there were 10 turkeys and some of the more regular prizes to be handed out. It was great to see so many people who traveled in to join us.

As we closed, Chip Kormas reminded everyone that the next match will be our **Christmas Match and Toys for Tots Fundraiser**, where in lieu of a shooter's fee, we collect cash or new unwrapped toy donations for the Toys for Tots. We hope everyone can come join us that day, and help raise funds for such a great organization. It will be Dec 20<sup>th</sup>.
