

FORMER RESIDENT DIES FLINT, MICH.

Charles W. Severn Passed Away
Last Saturday From Pleural
Pneumonia—Funeral Here On
Tuesday Morning

News was received here on Saturday evening that Charles W. Severn a resident of Elkton until about a year ago, had passed away in a Flint hospital at 10 o'clock that afternoon after a few weeks' illness of pleural pneumonia. Mr. Severn until a short time ago lived near Elkton, going to Flint where with his brother, Andrew, he engaged in the meat and grocery business. His son Kenneth, 23 years old, lived with him in Flint. In the summer of 1914 the deceased lost his wife in death. Charles W. Severn was born in Bay Port on September 8, 1879, and had lived in Huron County nearly all his life and had many friends in the community. He is survived by his son, Kenneth, one brother, Andrew, four sisters, Mrs. Fred Bouck of this city; Mrs. Art Morley of Twining, Mich.; Mrs. Sherman Graham of Peru, Indiana; and Mrs. Ralph Anderson of Alba, Mich., seven half brothers and two half sisters and his father, Isaac Severn and step-mother who live in Flint, Mich. Funeral services were held at ten o'clock Monday morning from the Evangelical church, Rev. Heise officiating at the last sad rites and delivering a most fitting eulogy on the deceased. Interment was in Riverside cemetery.
