## The City's Plans for Changes to San Pedro Avenue

Kudos to Carolynn for a great term as Rustling Leaves editor and thank you Carolynn for letting me take this space to share information that could impact the Woodward Mansion property and our access to it. In late May I learned about plans for changes to San Pedro Ave, which have been in the works for some time. I learned that the City plans to have a



special bus line – The Green Line – from the airport, down Isom to San Pedro and down San Pedro to Cypress St where it curves on to Navarro, St Mary's and Roosevelt Ave to end at Steves Ave. This Green Line is designed to make the two lanes down the middle of San Pedro (and the other streets) reserved for buses only with more than three lanes out of the middle at intersections with "bus stops". Extra space would be needed in the middle of the road because the plan is to have passengers wait for and get on/off the bus in the middle of the street.

No plan for a bus stop at French Place is shown, probably because there is no traffic light at our intersection. It is not shown whether San Pedro is planned go from 2 lanes north and 2 lanes south to 1 lane north and 1 lane south — or if a new lane south could be taken from the Club's front lawn. We have a lawn but between Hildebrand and French Pl, a new south lane would put traffic a few feet from the east wall of people's homes. If the plan is to not widen San Pedro for a Green Line, travel by car on the remaining lane south and remaining lane north will be slower moving, complicated by the fact that the design of the plan eliminates left turns or access to San Pedro unless at a traffic light Intersection. At traffic light intersections, the bus goes first, then left turns, then forward movement. Consolidation of left turns means more left turns at lighted intersections.

French Pl is not a traffic-light intersection so the plan might be to widen San Pedro southbound at the Mansion by one lane; and, because the plan is to encourage greater density land use, walking and biking – a wider sidewalk and a bike lane are pictured in some artist renderings. To avoid the difficulty of access to businesses etc. by private vehicle, the City will encourage all to ride The Green Line. According to the map diagram published in the May 24<sup>th</sup> issue of the San Antonio Report<sup>1</sup>, Woman's Club members could use the bus stops at Woodlawn Ave or Ashby Pl and walk up or down San Pedro on the new sidewalks.

**The most** astonishing part of this plan to me is that I was totally unaware of it until the 3<sup>rd</sup> week in May when I was invited to a meeting with residents and small business owners who live along the corridor. Property owners on San Pedro are receiving certified notices of authority to access and survey their properties.

The second most astonishing part of this plan to me – *is the plan*. While I would not disagree that sections of San Pedro would benefit from updates or upgrades, the methods proposed with this plan are stunning to me. It has been reported that VIA ridership currently covers 8% of the operating cost of VIA, the balance is taxpayer support. Planners assert that they can increase ridership with a plan that would include new zoning to limit owner modifications or redevelopment to changes that would bring a higher density, with targeted changes to land use for walkable master plan for the corridor. The budget for construction of the proposed Green Line is \$374.4M for the 11.7 miles. In 2015 voters added a clause to the city charter prohibiting altering city streets for streetcars or light rail without approval by the voters via a Proposition on the ballot expressly for that purpose. My personal opinion is that the resultant Article I, Section 3a. to the City Charter is not about metal wheels but about altering the city streets. Because I personally am not in favor of altering the San Pedro corridor for The Green Line plan, I have made inquiry to the group that alerted me to The Green Line whether they will have a petition to include a Proposition on the November ballot to allow voters to reassert the intent of Article I, Section 3a. If there is a petition, I hope you will consider signing it at the July gathering at the Woodward Mansion.
