

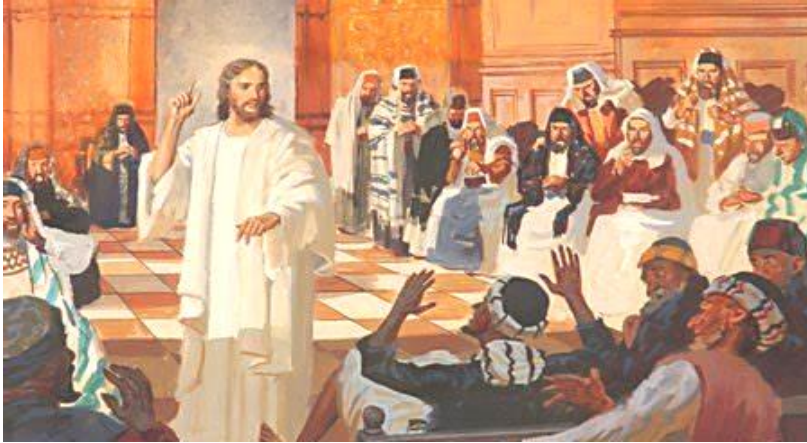

4th Sunday Ordinary Year B Mark 1:21-28



"Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

4th Sunday Ordinary Time

Year B

Mark 1:21-28

Racing thoughts. Racing heart. We all know the feeling of a panic-stricken moment. Maybe right after I close my truck door, and realize I just locked my keys in the truck on a trip far from home. Or maybe when I hear the phone ring in the middle of the night. Or I am obsessed with extreme worries about work details or health concerns. Or maybe when I am sliding along the highway down an ice covered hill toward oncoming traffic. Anything that overwhelms my mind with sudden fear or anxiety. These mentally terrifying experiences may be similar to the tormenting ideas and gripping feelings that the man in the gospel was experiencing before he encountered Jesus? **UNTIL**, Jesus spoke the words, **"Quiet! Come out of him!"** (Mark 1:25) Jesus took away the mental and emotional unrest that until then, was torturing and controlling the man. Jesus does that! He brings assurance and peace to us when we feel out of control or swept over by plunging feelings or strangling thoughts. This scene reminds me of another scene in Mark 4:39 when Jesus calms the sea that had provoked intense fear among his disciples. There, Jesus also, rebukes the wind and sea with similar words, **"Quiet! Be still!"** And the wind ceases. It brings about **'great calm'**. Jesus did it! He anchors us when we feel torn or tipped by whatever forces or waves. When we feel out of control, Jesus brings us a sense of trust, despite any feeling of helplessness, it is a trust in Him who will see us through them.

Calm in the chaos, and peace in the tempest. In John 14:27, Jesus tells us, "Peace I leave with you; **my peace I give to you**. Not as the world gives, do I give it to you. So, do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid" Later in John 16:33, He will add his desire, **"that you might have peace in me. In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world."** What Jesus tells the torturing demons, and the tossing waters, as the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:8) He similarly tells us, "Do not let your hearts be **troubled**" (John 14:1). I find Jesus' most comforting sentence ever to be from Matthew 11:28, **"Come to me**, all you who labor and are burdened, and **I will give you rest."** Jesus invites us, he wants to approach and come to Him. Usually, we have to first experience the 'burden' or the 'battering', before we turn to God, but Jesus says simply, "Come to me." In our wisest moments, we do go to Him first. But But also we have our days, when we try doing everything our own way, and what happens? Demons and disasters strike us. If not before, then for sure, we turn to our source of peace. Our surrender to God's will in prayer, brings not only His will but His peace. Like step 3 of any 12 step program, we have to make that decision "to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him." Then serenity is on its Way! Can any of us add a moment to our life-span by worrying? Jesus says, "If even the smallest things are beyond your control, why are you anxious about the rest?..... do not seek what you are to eat and what you are to drink, and **do not worry anymore**.....seek God's kingdom (His rule-His will), and these other things will be given you besides" (Luke 12:26, 29, 31) Again, Jesus alone can bring that peaceful acceptance and inner strength, if you 'go to Him'. I love how the 12th promise of AA says it, "We will suddenly realize that **God is doing for us what we could not do for ourselves**" (chapter 6 of the AA Big Book). If we ask the man in the gospel about his encounter with Jesus, I am sure he will say, "After having tried everything else, I went to Jesus and for the first time in my life, I now know **'Quiet!'**

I pray that we all have some time each day that we set aside to plug into this 'stillness' and 'quiet' that God alone can bring us. I know the temptation to busyness and the drive to control (stay on top), but if it is only by our own efforts and means, then we are bound to be caught in the chaos around us, and the racing around us will enter into us and lead to those 'racing hearts and racing thoughts' that only torment and tear us apart. But through it all, Jesus is close, waiting for us to 'come' or to 'call' and He eagerly enters our lives to bring that peace, stillness and quiet!
