

Dear Brothers and Sisters In Christ:

Hope everyone's summer is going well. Hard to believe that it is August already. I want to thank everyone for keeping up with their tithes while away on vacations this summer. We have gotten some numbers back on replacing the roof on our church. Looks like the best numbers have come in from Beverage's Home Improvement at \$18,300 which is a savings of almost \$6000 from other bids. Next we have to decide how we will finance this cost to the church so we can get going on these much needed repairs as soon as possible. I will be speaking to the congregation after each of the 3 church services to give additional information and to get feedback from everyone. Monies for this project can come from fund raisers, the building fund or church account. A special voters meeting will take place after the 10:30 AM service on August 18th to make the final decision.

Look forward to seeing everyone at our annual Fall Rally Day picnic on September 8th. A great day of coming together after vacations have taken us in many different directions over the summer to enjoy a day of fellowship and great food. A work day will be scheduled as well in the weeks to come to spruce up the church grounds. More information will be coming once a date is set.

Message From the Building and Grounds Chairperson

I want to start this months' report with a few notes of praise. The first is for Gayle Gepert and Jimmy Swain for their ongoing efforts of cutting all of the the grass at the Church weekly. Our church has a large lawn and this is no easy task to maintain. I would also like to thank Joel Solberg for his work this summer in clearing the brush along the fence line and playground. When you see these individuals please thank them for their commitment to maintaining our Church grounds.

Roof Replacement Proposals

Replacing the roof has been identified as a top priority for church building maintenance projects. We currently have guttering and facia boards that have pulled away from the rafters and deteriorating plywood in these areas. The shingles themselves have exceeded their expected lifespan and need to be replaced. We received two proposals for replacing the roof shingles and associated work.

The first proposal includes a price of \$23,900 for a three tab shingle and includes removing the guttering and repairing the facia boards and installing new guttering. The proposal includes an optional architectural shingle for an additional \$1,700. The architectural shingle is a better shingle, and has a longer warranty. The architectural shingle is recommended which would bring this first proposal to a total of \$25,600.

A second proposal for the roof includes the architectural shingles , removing the guttering, repairing the facia boards and installing new guttering. The proposed cost for this second proposal is \$18,300.

At the July 11, 2019 Church Council meeting the Council voted to proceed with roof repairs as quickly as possible contingent upon final costs with the work being performed by the second proposer. Funding will be determined after receiving input from the congregation.

Our Rally Day Celebration will begin with Sunday School from 9 AM to 10:15 AM followed by a special worship service which will include our Sunday School children leading the congregation in singing a couple of their favorite VBS songs from this summer's "ROAR". (*If you were unable to attend this summer, don't worry, the words will be projected for all to follow along!*) Following the worship service all are invited to stay for our annual Rally Day Fellowship picnic which will include games, tasty food, a fun moon bounce and great fellowship. Drinks, hotdogs, hamburgers, etc. will be provided. Please bring a side dish and or a dessert to share! We thank our Thrivent team once again for helping to sponsor this great chance for all of us to come together as a church family! All are invited and please bring a friend!

We will also be having a **Sunday school teachers' meeting on Wednesday, August 14th at 6:30 PM**. During Jesus' last three years on earth, He spent a lot of time nourishing and teaching His disciples. Only when they were prepared to go out into the world to preach, teach, and heal did He send them. In Matthew 6:40-42 Jesus, referring to His disciples said, "He who receives you receives Me and he who receives Me receives the One who sent Me. Anyone who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and anyone who receives a righteous man because he is a reightoues man will receive a righteous man's reward. And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is My disciple, I tell you in truth, he will certainly not lose his reward." Jesus told His disciples that whoever gives to you is also giving to Him. Although support today doesn't fund the work of the 12 original disciples, we assist in the spreading of the Gospel by supporting today's disciples and missionaries around the world, as well as supporting our church. As we provide for the church and church workers locally and abroad in the name of Jesus, we are serving the Lord Himself.

As we express our Christain faith through our giving and serving, God is pleased. God notices every act of compassion and kindness that we express. In the verse above, He refers to even the simple gesture of giving a cup of cold water to a thirsty person. With our current heat wave, we may have a better perspective of how important that cup of cold water can be but regardless of the temperature, a cup of water is completely a simple and humble gift. Through our faith, we are empowered to do acts of service. When we act in response to the Lord and not for recognition, God will bless us.
