The Resurrection of Jesus

"Why seek ye the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen." Joyful words from heavenly messengers to sorrowing disciples who sought their Lord's body in a grave.

But the grave couldn't hold Him, praise God! It was necessary for Jesus to die a physical death that we might be saved from sin, but you cannot kill God, and Jesus was God manifest in the flesh. He had power to lay down His life and power to take it again.

It is doubtful if the disciples at first understood the full import of the resurrection of Jesus. We wonder if today we realize the full significance of the fact that Jesus is not dead but alive forever more.

The resurrection of Jesus proved to the world that His death of a not merely the heroic death of a noble martyr, but the sacrificial death of the Son of God. As the scripture says He was "declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead.' In very truth He was the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world. When God raised Him from the dead He put His stamp of approval upon His life and upon everything that He promised and taught.

There was a time when God winked at men's ignorance of God and the things of God; but now He commands all men everywhere to repent. There is no longer any need for people to live in sin. Jesus died to save us from sin. So God's message to men everywhere is, Repent and believe the gospel, trust in Jesus as your Saviour. The reason for this is that there is going to be a judgment day, and we must all stand before God in judgment. The resurrection of Jesus is the pledge that God has given the human family that there will be a judgment day. "Because He hath appointed a day, in which He will judge the world in righteousness by that man whom He hath ordained; whereof He HATH GIVEN ASSURANCE UNTO ALL MEN, in that HE HATH RAISED HIM FROM THE

DEAD. Just as surely as Jesus rose from the dead there is going to be a judgment day where we shall all give an account for the deeds done in the body.



The fact that Jesus rose from the dead is a firm foundation for faith in God. "Who by Him do believe in God, that raised Him from the dead, and gave Him glory; that your faith and hope might be in God." The resurrection of Jesus not only proves the power of God, but it also reveals to us the love and mercy of God. A God who loves me well enough to give His Son to die for me, and who has power to raise Him from the dead, is a God in whom I can believe. I can fully trust in His love, mercy and power.

Many people have great hope for the future because of something in which they feel they can trust. The christian has in the resurrection of Jesus the best foundation upon which to build his hope for the future. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to His abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a LIVELY HOPE BY THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you."

While it is true that christians have a living hope as a result of the resurrection of Jesus, we should never forget that it is not a Christ merely living in heaven who gives us hope, but "Christ in you the

hope of glory." A living Christ dwelling in our hearts by faith. Because of the resurrection of Jesus the christian has the hope of eternal life, the hope of some day being like Jesus and of living in one of the mansions He has gone to prepare for us. Because He lives, we shall live also. "For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so every man in his own order: Christ the first fruits; afterward they that are Christ's at His coming."

The Woman of old had suffered twelve years, she had spent all with physicians but steadily grew worse. After spending all that she might have health and life she heard of Jesus and His healing. CHIANG KAI-SHEK DESIRES CHRISTIAN WORKERS

A wireless report coming out of Chungking states that Chiang Kai-Shek has asked the National Christian Council to enlist one thousand Christian workers as morale officers in the Chinese army. This is said to be the first time in history that a non-Christian nation has set up a Christian chaplaincy for its Armed Forces.

THE VATICAN AND THE KREMLIN

There is constant firing back at each other between the Vatican and the Kremlin; charges and countercharges are multiple. The Vatican is anxious about the 84,000,000 Catholics in central and eastern European countries. The Vatican charges that Moscow has used "harsh words" and seems to fear that these words reflect Moscow's plans for external action.

CATHOLIC PERSECUTION IN MEXICO

Luis Maria Martinez charges that the Catholics launched an anti-Protestant "crusade": he further states, "We are suffering a tremendous persecution on the part of the Catholic Church, but are asking our preachers to pray for them and to forgive them." Mexico is about 90 per cent Catholic. The Protestants there, however, are working together to strengthen themselves and have quite an amount of political support.

Paul tells us the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils. (I Tim. 4). But I also find Jude tells us to earnestly contend for the faith once delivered to the saints. Jude 2 makes us to know that God still requires us to live soberly, righteously and Godly in this present world.

Be ye examples of the christian believers in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity, and could lead on softly as Jacob did in leading his family and flocks and herds back to his father's house. Gen. 33:14. We can experience real unity of the faith and can begin to see the perfect man unveil unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ. These things shall ye do and greater because I go to my Father.

May the Lord bind our lives together as we walk with all low-liness and meekness, with long-suffering, forbearing one another in love, endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. Eph. 4:2-3.

might fortify the faith of some to remind our readers that the Jewish leaders remembered that Jesus had said after three days He would rise again. So they persuaded Pilate to place a guard around the sepulchre. In addition to the guard a huge stone was placed to close the opening of the sepulchre and the stone was sealed with the seal of the Roman government. Anyone who broke that seal was defying the Roman government and put his life in jeopardy. When we remember how Peter cursed and denied that he even knew Jesus, and when we are told that the disciples fled when Jesus was apprehended by His enemies, we know that His disciples didn't have the courage to break through the Roman guard and steal His body. Also, the fact that the disciples who were so discouraged and fearful of the orthodox Jews experienced such a moral change as to convince anyone that something had happened to give them a new courage and boldness they did not previously have. What was that something that wrought such a great change in the disciples? They had seen Jesus, not dead but alive, praise the Lord. And their living Lord after He ascended filled them with the Holy Spirit. So we can say that the empty tomb and the great moral change in the disciples after Pentecost prove that Jesus is alive. There are many living proofs today of the resurrection of Jesus. Jesus is daily working miracles of grace in the lives of those who trust Him. When a sinner is saved from sin, he is not saved only because Jesus died for him but also because He arose for our justification.

will I trust.'



There are some Christians who seem to have no time for the Jews and praying for them as commanded (Psalms 122: 6), is far from their thoughts, but do they ever think that, for all eternity, they will gaze upon the names of Jews, because in the New Jerusalem on the twelve gates there will be the names of the twelve tribes of Israel, and on the twelve foundations will be the names of the Apostles (Revelations 21: 9-14) so, every soul in the New Jerusalem, whether they look up or down, will see, for all time, the names of Jews. Moreover, has not God said of Israel: "Behold, I have graven thee upon the palms of My hands; thy walls are continually before Me" (Isaiah 49: 16). How they can any Christian, with confidence, "stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ" (Romans 14: 10-12) and confess that they had never prayed for the Jews? Then shall He answer them, saying: "Verily I say unto you inasmuch as ye did it not to one of the least of these (My brethren in the flesh) ye did it not to Me" (Matthew 25:45). Wont they be ashamed at His coming? A solemn thought. Will you be one of the ashamed

A Glorious Example!

Jesus prayed for His brethren in the flesh. "Father forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23: 34). Nehemiah prayed (Chapter 1: 6) "day and night." Daniel (Chapter 6: 10) "three times a day, prayed, and gave thanks, and his windows being open toward Jerusalem."

Prayer, in church or any hall where the Word of God is preached, and daily in private, brings blessing. "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: they shall prosper that love thee." (Psalm 122: 6.) A new peace, and added light and love for the Jew comes into a believer's life when he (or she) faithfully and consistently prays daily for the Jews. This is an added peace to the peace given to a soul who trusts Jesus for eternal salvation.

There was a Scotsman, an earn-

est Christian, who had a dislike for the Jews and it is said that he had a dream, one night, of heaven. He arrived there and spent some time admiring its beauty. Then an angel appeared and he said to that being: "This is indeed beautiful, but I have not seen any people. I want to see Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, the Apostles, and especially my hero, Paul." "Ah!" said the angel. "They are all Jews. Moreover, Jesus, Himself, was a Jew, and when you were upon the earth you disliked the Jews, so we thought, in order to avoid disturbing thoughts, we would place you in a part of heaven where you would never see the face of a Jew.' The Scotsman suddenly awoke. He had been taught a lesson. From that time he was an ardent champion for the rights of Jews and prayed for and resented the wrongs done them. There is a moral in this dream. Reader! Does it apply to you?

And Samuel said unto the people: "For the Lord will not forsake His people for His great name's sake; because it hath pleased the Lord to make you His people. Moreover, as for me, God forbid that I should sin against the Lord in ceasing to pray for you; but I will teach you the good and the right way" (1 Samuel 12: 20-

"I, being in the way, the Lord led me to the house of my master's brethren," said Abraham's servant to Rebekah (Genesis 24: 27), and that will be the lot of those—"the right way"—who faithfully pray for the Jews. And every Jew and Christian who is not praying daily "for the peace of Jerusalem" is sinning daily because

Specific Cases Where God's Hand Seemed to Intervene

A discerning analysis of the events of this war reveal great crises when the battle and even the war could as easily have been lost or won. But in these critical emergencies some providential occurrence turned the tide in favor of the Allies. Let us enumerate specific instances.

The Miracle at Dunkirk

Nearly half a million British troops were trapped and Germany was moving in for the kill. Military authorities estimated that, under favorable circumstances 30,000 might be evacuated. But the fog and heavy weather settled down. The Germans did their utmost, but for ten days a thousand craft taxied back and forth across the Channel until 335,000 men had landed safely on British soil.

This has been pronounced a miracle. But what many do not remember is that the King of England, just prior to this, called his people to their knees to beseech Almighty God to intervene in this humanly hopeless situation.

Hitler's Attack on Russia

The best generals of Germany counselled against this hazardous procedure. But Hitler over-ruled them, saying that with the great resources of Russia they could conquer Europe and eventually the world. Was it not a stroke of divine providence which led Hitler to this decision? It is plain now that there would have been no human possibility of the Allies winning without the help of Russia, which then had no intention of entering the war against Germany.

The Landing on North Africa

When our vast invasion fleet was nearing the Azores, reports were received that enemy submarines were infesting the waters and would likely strike. Secretary Knox could not sleep and asked his wife to read from the Psalms which describes God fighting against His enemies. For some reason the attack by the submarines was not

made. As the fleet neared the African shores, two storms were reported heading that way, which would have made a landing impossible. But the storms neutralized each other. An old Frenchman at Casablanca reported that the sea was calmer that particular night than it had been for 60 years. In normal times at that season in an average of only seven days out of thirty would such a landing be possible. General George C. Marshall said: "The hand of the Lord was with us."



The Crisis at El Alamein

Rommel's forces were making their drive on Egypt. Had they succeeded, all Africa would have been lost and Russia could have been out flanked at the Caucasus. The Germans were in sight of Alexandria with only fifty miles to go. Then a dust storm arose between them and their goal. Both armies were near the breaking point. The Germans were famishfor water. They found a water pipe-line and shot holes in it. The men dropped to their knees and drank. But on that particular day the line was being tested with salt water. That is what finished the German's fighting strength and won the war at El Alamein.

The Invasion of Sicily

Ernie Pyle, a great reporter but who seldom gives any credit to God, was in one of the battleships on this expedition. He tells of the storm which threatened the whole undertaking. The sea became mountainous with the wind blowing at 40 miles an hour. Fifty per cent of the soldiers were deathly seasick. The searchlights of Sicily began to play upon them. Five of them focused on his ship. He said they were "sitting ducks." But one by one the lights blinked out and they were never able to explain why the big guns on the coast did not fire. When they reached the shore Pyle said, looked down and the green surface of the Mediterranean was smooth as a table top. Not a breath of air stirred. . . . The miracle had happened."

The Invasion of France

Here again Ernie Pyle speaks of miracle. He says: "Now that it is over it seems to me a pure miracle that we ever took the beach at all Where I am now our troops faced such odds that our getting ashore was like my whipping Joe Louis down to a pulp. .. The advantages were all theirs, the disadvantages all ours." He tells of the machine gun nests, concrete walls, funnel-like traps, barbed wire entanglements, terrific under water obstacles, etc., etc. Then he said: "We sit and talk and call it a miracle that our men ever got on at all or were able to stay on.'

The Forty Minutes at Preenemunde

This is called the forty minutes that changed the war. Here was the secret base for the production of the flying bombs. The Germans staked everything on this last hope. The scientists of Germany were concentrated here. By mass production they could soon be sending their bombs by thousands on their deadly mission. But the guarded secret was discovered. A fleet of 600 RAF heavy night bombers on the night of August 17 started in the direction of Berlin. They maneuvered into a surprise attack on Preenmunde instead and left it in ruin. Besides the destruction of their assembly shops and laboratories, 5,000 of the 7,000 scientists and technicians stationed there were killed or missing.

Shall we credit these remarkable events and providences to the intelligence and skill of mere man? "Canst thou send lightnings, that they may go, and say unto thee, here we are?" "Who can number the clouds in wisdom? Or who can stay the battles of heaven?"

The answer: "I will not trust in my bow, neither shall my sword save me. But Thou hast saved us from our enemies, and hast put them to shame that hated us. In God we will boast all the day long, and praise Thy name forever and ever."
