

Peter's Pence Collection

"A little mercy makes the world less cold and more just." Pope Francis, *Angelus*, March 17, 2013

Please consider supporting Pope Francis' work through the Peter's Pence collection. This collection unites us in solidarity with the Holy Father and his works of charity toward those who are suffering around the world.

For example, in Nyamirambo, a suburb of Kigali, Rwanda, the Salesian Sisters of the Sacred Hearts run the "Filippo Smaldone" Institute. Here the sisters provide poor, hearing-impaired, and vulnerable children with an education. Without this education, these children would live their lives on the margins of society, and never be fully integrated into it. With contributions from the Peter's Pence Collection, the institute's building will be expanded and renovated completely to allow more children to attend classes and lectures, giving them a brighter future of hope.

Checks payable to St. Cecilia with a notation of "Peter's Pence" may be placed in the regular collection basket during Mass. Thank you!

St. C's Recycling/Organics Program Reminders

Blue bins represent recycling

We have a single-sort option so all cardboard, paper, aluminum, tin, and plastics, numbers 1-7 can go in these bins. Please be sure to rinse any containers before placing them in the bin.

Green bins indicate an organics collection

We have these green bins in the choir room, office kitchen, bathrooms, and fellowship hall. Organics include food waste, paper towels, tissues, flowers, compostable dinnerware, napkins, and pizza boxes.

Gray or black bins

Are for collecting any remaining garbage.

All of the bins have signage to help remind you where items should go and the office staff is here to help with any questions. In the church, link and meeting rooms you will find stainless steel "dual" bins. The blue side is for recycling and the black for garbage.

If ever you're in doubt of which bin to place specific items, please set those items aside and our Maintenance Coordinator will be happy to take care of that for you.

Collections

In the lower level link you will see labeled collection bins. In these bins we collect cell phones (<u>no</u> chargers, cords or phone batteries), ink/toner cartridges, film plastics, and batteries, as well as children's books for College Prep Elementary and home goods for Bridging. Please take note of the kinds of items that we collect and check your items before placing them in the bins. This will cut down on the time needed to go through the collections and make it easier for our volunteers to sort and/or ship.

We also collect non-perishable food and toiletries for our neighborhood food shelf. All donations are delivered to Keystone Community Services food shelf.

Clean, gently worn clothing, as well as purses, belts and shoes are also collected and distributed to those in need. Please note: If you have many bags of items to donate we encourage you to take them directly to a donation center.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

Project Home August 19th-24th

Our parish community is responding in powerful ways to the Gospel call to give shelter to the homeless. In addition to Habitat for Humanity, St. Cecilia's will once again take part in Project Home. This is a year-round program sponsored by Interfaith Action of Greater St. Paul. They bring 20 emergency beds to two volunteering sites each month, hosting only families. Our neighbors at St. Matthew's Episcopal (2136 Carter Ave.) has opened their doors during the entire month of August for many years. You can imagine how difficult it is to line up volunteers, especially in the summer months. It is possible though, if we work together! Along with three other faith communities, St. Cecilia's has partnered with St. Matthew's for many years. This summer, from August 19th through the 24th, we will provide volunteers to welcome families, (3-6 people) and to spend the night with them (1-2 people). St. Matthew's will again offer a volunteer training session after the 10:00am Mass on Sunday, July 22nd, for anyone who might wish to attend. Please consider being a part of this effort. It is a wonderful individual or family ministry...we are all called to do what we can, to answer the Gospel call to work for justice.
