What gets in your way of waiting? What distracts you from being patient, waiting, and listening? Ponder these things while you wait for the birth of Jesus. It is good for all of us to spend time with what it means to be patient and listening during this time of year.

At the Session meeting in November, we

agreed to become what is known as a "Matthew 25" church. We will learn more about what it means to be a Matthew 25 church in the coming months. In the meantime, please read and ponder Matthew 25:34-37. I have included it below:

> Then the king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the

world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me. Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink?" NRSV

We all need to be able to answer the questions. When did or do we notice that others were hungry, thirsty, naked, sick, or in prison? When do we reach out to care for God's people: our family, our friends, our neighbors, or strangers? What is God calling you to do as a Christian? Whether we are young or not-soyoung, we are called. We are called to pay attention to others, not just ourselves. We are called to reach out to others. As you wait, take time to ponder just what this means for you, your life and the life of the congregation at CPC.

MATTHEW 25

# WHAT'S UP WITH STEWARDSHIP?

Actually, quite a bit. Since January of 2019, various members of the Stewardship Committee have participated in three workshops on generosity and giving. These have been organized by Fargo First Presbyterian Church. As a result, we decided in August to ask the Session to support a capital campaign to retire our mortgage obligation ahead of schedule (currently our mortgage is set to expire October, 2023.)

At September's meeting, Session voted to support this. So in October we held two brainstorming meetings to gauge member support and most importantly to get feedback on the best way to conduct a successful campaign. The good news is, we visited with about 20 members and friends. All expressed a desire to support the effort, through their ideas, sweat, and dollars. Early in November, the committee, based on that feedback, began planning for a capital campaign in 2020.

The goal would be to retire our mortgage before the end of the year. If we are successful, this will save our church about \$6,000 in interest, but it would also have two other positive impacts. It would focus our church giving around a goal, and it would open the way, financially, to refocus our resources on growing the church, rather than on servicing debt.

At the time of this writing, the committee is planning on launching this enterprise, with many more details, after the new year--with one notable exception. Dawn Larson, who participated in one of the brainstorming meetings, was so fired up she wanted to organize a fundraising extravaganza on December 18. Details can be found elsewhere in this newsletter. The Stewardship Committee is grateful for her enthusiasm and we urge your participation.

Meanwhile, stay tuned. Most especially, we ask for prayers for wisdom and inspiration for a successful campaign.

### HAVE YOU NOTICED?

Have you noticed the youth in our church? Some of them play the piano before Sunday School or occasionally as part of the pianist rotation. Some offer special music from time to time or sing in the choir. Many assist in the lighting of the candles at the beginning of the worship service. Some play sports or cheer for local school teams. Some may have been seen tending the church's garden. Many attend Sunday School and worship regularly. Most enjoy the treats after worship.

All of them need a new youth director.

The new youth director doesn't need special skills. Christian Education can help with programs and schedules. BUT the new director does need to meet each of our youth and to take the time to connect and listen to what is important to them.




