<u>CHRISTMAS TOY SERVICE – 5TH DECEMBER</u>

Our All-Age Family Service in December is when we have traditionally brought gifts of toys, usually outgrown and "pre-loved", to go to children who would otherwise not receive Christmas presents.

Last year, any such undertaking was impossible; this year, we cannot collect second-hand toys under COVID protocols, but the Salvation Army have asked if we can collect new toys which they can pass on to children in families for whom the past months have been especially tough, and who need some kindness and support to enjoy a Christmas with presents to open, and a few of the little treats we tend to take for granted.

To quote their Appeal:

"With your help again this year, we are launching our Present Appeal, providing gifts and hampers to children within the looked-after system and families who may not be able to buy the items which make Christmas a special time of year.....[so that] we are able to make gift parcels for 0-16 year olds, and hampers which include Christmas Puddings, Christmas Crackers, Tubs of Chocolates, Christmas biscuits and Mince Pies. If you are able to help in anyway, the community who receive these parcels are truly grateful......"

So we are asking this year if you can bring to our 10 a.m. Family Service on 5th December: New/unused toys suitable for any age from babies to 16 year-olds [no Christmas wrapping please]*

Items for including in a Christmas hamper: crackers, Christmas biscuits, bought mince pies and Christmas puddings, tubs of chocolates..... [no alcohol, please]

*Romford S.A. tell us that vouchers are not passed directly to the recipients but are used to buy presents for them; they would prefer that if these are donated, they should be easily redeemed in local shops such as Boots or Marks & Spencer.

No cash for this collection please, but Romford Salvation Army have a Just Giving page if you would like to make a monetary gift to their work.

You have been unfailingly generous in the past: please consider whether you can help make Christmas 2021 special for local children and families for whom the past year has been especially grim.

ADVENT CANDLE LITURGY – 2021 for East & West Cluster Churches LECTIONARY YEAR C

Advent comes from the Latin word 'adventus' meaning 'Coming.' Advent begins the church year starting four Sundays before Christmas. The season of Advent has been set aside as a time of preparation since the 6th century.

This liturgy is based on words from the Gospel of Luke and from the Prophet Isaiah – it is optional as to whether or not the full passage is used. Please feel free to use any Advent hymns of your choice.

<u>5th December 2021 - Advent 2</u> —Isaiah 40. 1-11 (the first candle is lit before worship commences)

Reader 1: A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God".

Reader 2: In the beginning was the Word—spoken and breathed, a promise made and kept.

All: Speak it loud and clear—God's promise is true!

Reader 1: The Word was in the beginning, and through God all things come into being.

All: Eternal and near at hand. Already and not-yet, God's promise is the foundation of all life.

Reader 2: Do not hold back! Speak out, giving voice to God's peace that passes all understanding.

Reader 1: "Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

Reader2: Today we light the candle of Peace

The second Advent candle is lit

REMOVAL OF RESTRICTIONS

We are now able to welcome back a little more normality to our services than we have over the last few weeks, and we look forward to more being able to join us within the Church.

If you enjoy singing this is now permitted and you will be able to mix and engage, if they are willing, with other members of the congregation.

However, we are mindful that not everyone is 100% comfortable with 'no restrictions' so we will be trying to accommodate those that are embracing the removal of restrictions and those that want to take things a bit slower.

We intend to do the following to help with the changes:

Our welcome/door stewards will continue to wear masks to greet you Hand sanitiser will continue to be available at the door

You are asked to continue to scan the QR code or record your details on the forms provided The windows and doors will continue to be open to provide ventilation

Those not wishing to wear masks and wanting to sing will be asked to sit in the front pews, leaving the first two rows unoccupied

Those wishing to wear masks and/or maintain social distance will be asked to sit in the rear pews

There will currently be no distribution of hymn books or an offertory collection, please continue to give online

At the end of services those at the rear of the Church will be offered to leave first We want you to feel safe and relaxed, so please let a steward know if there is anything else they can do for you to achieve this when you are in the Church.

While we would love to see you in person, you can continue to join the services via Zoom.
