

Bylaw Changes

At the annual convention the nobility approved twenty-three changes. These are the main changes that effect the Units directly. Please read the bylaws to familiarize yourself with all the changes.

- The annual dues have been increased from two dollars (\$2.00) to four dollars (\$4.00) a member, with the Units having less than ten members increased to forty (\$40.00) per Unit. This increase will be effective January 1, 2025
- Deleted the DD214 reference and change to read proof of service according to the countries requirements to include national guard and reservist.
- Change "Active" member to "Regular" member. Added statement "Regular member is the only member authorized to wear the LOH Medallion".
- If a Unit that is suspended it is not authorized to wear the IALOH medallion and must stop representing the IALOH


