FROM THE VICAR

Of all the available topics that could be discussed in this month's article, there's one that I feel almost obligated to discuss. After all, he and I share the same name, and neither he nor I are Irish, despite what people might think. I'm talking, of course, about St. Patrick, Missionary to Ireland. As with many of the saints and heroes of the faith who we remember on special days, Patrick has a very interesting story, and one that we can learn quite a bit from.

Contrary to what is often thought, Patrick was actually from what is today England. His father Calpornius was a city councilor, which made the family low ranking Roman nobility. Patrick's upbringing would have been quite comfortable for that era. However, this comfortable life took a sudden turn for the worse when he was captured by slavers and sold across the sea to the Irish. He was a slave for six years, until finally escaping and boarding a ship bound for Britain. Back in safety and civilization, Patrick's story could have come to a conclusion there, a nice point for "and they lived happily ever after." God had other plans, though! After many years spent in France and Italy training as a priest, Patrick went back to Ireland, to the people who had enslaved him, to preach the Gospel. After many years of hard work traveling throughout the island, preaching to kings and farmers, debating druids and pagan priests, Patrick died and was buried in Ireland, among the people he had loved and cared for.

Stories of people like St. Patrick help point us to Christ. Christ came from heaven to a people who misunderstood him, ignored him, and even hated him. He preached the Good News, calling all to repent and believe. He showed compassion to the lowest of the low, those whom no one could or would help. He would give up his life for all on the cross, dying that they might have life and salvation. As we enter into this season of Lent, we focus on that great love of Christ, who suffered and died for us unworthy sinners. And we know that He loves us and cares for us still, no matter what the future holds.
