God Uses Broken Things

If something is broken, we generally discard it. However, God uses broken things to accomplish His purposes.

God used broken pitchers (Judges 7). Gideon conquered the Midianites by putting their lamps within pitchers; at his direction, the soldiers broke their pitchers and revealed the light, which greatly confused the Midianites, and they were defeated. The light of truth is often hidden by error, and it is when the error is broken that the light is revealed.

God used broken tables of stone (Exodus 32). Aaron had erected the golden calf because Moses had been gone and the people thought they had been abandoned. When Moses came down off the mount and saw what was happening, "he cast the tables out of his hands, and brake them" (Exodus 32:19). He then took the golden calf, burned it in the fi re, and ground it to powder. Next, he put it in the water supply and made the people drink it (Exodus 32:20). We must get rid of the world from our lives.

God used a broken alabaster box (Mark 14). "And she brake the box, and poured it on his head" (Mark 14:3). With this, the woman did what she could; we also must do what we can.

God used the broken body of Jesus (Matthew 26). When He instituted the Lord's Supper, Jesus took bread and blessed it (Matthew 26). Paul later wrote, quoting the Lord, "Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you" (1 Corinthians 11:24). Note from the Scripture that His bones were not broken: "A bone of him shall not be broken" (John 19:36; Psalm 34:20).

God used the broken heart of David (Psalm 51). We must have a broken heart over our sin. David said, "A broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise" (Psalm 51:17).

Yes, God uses broken things. Perhaps your life has been broken by sin, but unlike Humpty Dumpty and the king's horses and men, God can put it back together again.

What Are You Doing When the Preacher Is Preaching?

It really is important, you know, what you do when the preacher is preaching. The vast majority of the world is not even in the room when a preacher preaches on any given Sunday. Of those that are, far and away the majority of them are under the tutelage of a false preacher receiving a perverted "gospel" message. Of those few that are where the truth is being preached by a faithful man, what are they doing?

Perhaps they are thinking about what happened in the last week. Maybe about troubles at home or problems with the neighbors or difficulties at the office. Perhaps the children had a bad week at school. Maybe the car broke down. Maybe the bills were bigger than the paycheck. It could be anything.

Perhaps they are thinking about the week to come. Making plans for the supper they have invited friends to. Trying to remember which nights which kid plays baseball.
