2022 Dog tags and Kennel License may be purchased until March 31st with fees as follows:

\$ 2.00 Spayed/neutered \$ 4.00 Unaltered pets

\$10.00 Kennel License (3+ dogs)

As of April 1st unpaid tags/licenses will be assessed penalties, increasing fees to:

\$ 7.00 Spayed/neutered \$ 9.00 Unaltered pets \$40.00 Kennel License (3+ dogs)

Please bring cash or check for payment. If paying by check make checks payable to "Red Barn" for vaccines and "City of Moran" for Dog Tags/Kennel License.

### **Burn Permits**

The City of Moran regulates open burns within the City Limits through a permit process. Residents may apply for a free burn permit Monday through Friday between 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM at Moran city Hall. Application will be approved by a member of the Moran Fire Department. This is a simple process and helps us ensure the safety of our residents.

Please take note that residents who fail to follow the burn permit process will be subject to the following fines as well as court costs: 1st offense \$25.00, 2nd offense \$50.00, 3rd offense \$75.00

### **Construction Ahead**

The City of Moran was among 40 rural communities to be awarded the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in the amount of \$450,000.00. In addition to \$77,000.00 from

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and a \$373,000.00 matching KDHE loan. These resources will be going towards updating 12,000 linear feet of our water supply system. Stay tuned for more updates!



### **STORM Shelter & SIREN Policy**

Moran's warning sirens are audibly tested each day at noon, weather permitting. On Tuesdays at noon Allen County 911 tests the sirens for 30 seconds to ensure the warning system is working correctly. Moran has two above ground storm shel-



ters; one is located behind City Hall with the second located at the City Park. On occasion, technicians may test individual sirens at random times. In the event a tornado warning is declared for Allen County sirens are sounded for three continuous minutes with a 10 second pause between each alert. Additionally, the Moran Fire Department may use the sirens to alert volunteer firemen when fire calls are received.

#### Sirens are sounded as follows

- <u>DAILY</u>—all sirens sounded for 10 seconds at noon Monday through Friday
- <u>TORNADO</u>—sirens sound continually for 3 minutes with a 10 second pause between sirens.
- **CITY FIRE**—sirens sound once for 10 seconds
- RURAL FIRE—sirens sound twice for 10 seconds each
