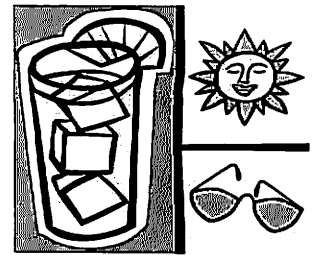

As you are probably aware, the City Council approved the zoning application for a bakery and a used car sales business to operate near the Randolph Blvd. entrance to Royal Ridge. It was disappointing to see that our councilman, Mike Gallagher, voted in favor of the zoning change. The majority of residents opposed the zoning change. **Bob Robbins, Bobby Younts** and I told Mike of the opposition at a meeting. I understand that Mike's office received more favorable votes from individuals. That was the reason for his favorable zoning vote.



Since Mike previously served as president of the Neighborhood Alliance (made up of neighborhood associations), it is difficult to understand why he would prefer a number of votes by individuals, rather than the stated position in opposition of the neighborhood association. The Royal Ridge Neighborhood Association represents approximately 1,100 homes.

It is hard to provide a better example why your votes matters. Let us all work to ensure that Royal Ridge does matter. Whatever your opinion, in the future let us work to speak with one voice. Zoning matters aside, that is the way to ensure that Royal Ridge is important in decisions made by the city that affect you and your pocket book.

Please let me know your opinions on this and other issues facing our neighborhood. Your next chance is the **annual meeting** of the Royal Ridge Neighborhood Association (RRNA) on **Tuesday, October 7, 2014, 6-8 PM** in conjunction with the National Night Out. It will be at the Royal Ridge Clubhouse at 5859 Royal Ridge Drive.

I have contacted our various homeowners associations to ensure that each is aware of the changes necessary to comply with the new Texas statutes. New rules include flag displays, rainwater collection, solar energy use, displaying religious items and payment plans for association dues. Our Homeowner Associations should give residents at

least 72-hour's notice of a Board meeting. Annual or semi-annual meetings should have at least 10-day's notice and not more than 60-day's notice. I encourage the various Boards to post meeting notices at the Clubhouse on the outside bulletin board. This should be in addition to email and/or newsletter notices.

Tom Bingham is the Treasurer of RRNA. He will be moving away from Royal Ridge next year and we need someone to replace him. Please let me know if you are willing to join the association. Our neighborhood can use your help.

RRNA has agreed to bring the *Royal Ridge Recorder* newsletter under its umbrella. With the dissolution of the Women's Club, it needed a home. **Janet Latiolais** has worked tirelessly keep the Recorder going through this transition. We all owe her a debt of gratitude.

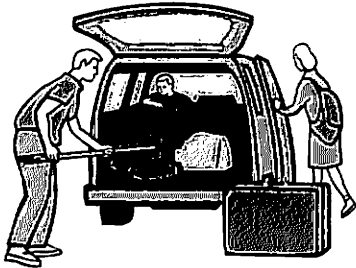

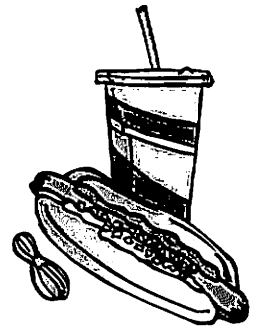

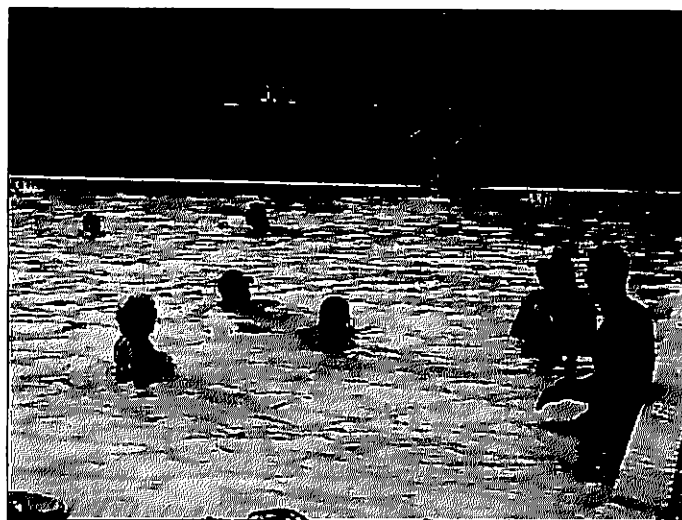
