PALM SUNDAY LITANY Lay Liturgist – Cheryl Fisher

Leader: Today we recall the events of the first Holy Week so many years ago.

People: We remember how it started with Jesus entering the Holy City.

Leader: As he approached Bethpage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' tell him, 'The Lord needs it.'"

People: Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as Jesus had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" They replied, "The Lord needs it."

Leader: They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road. When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen, saying:

LENTEN BIBLE STUDY

Every Wednesday evening through March 31, 2021 from 7:00 pm to 7:30 pm, Dr. Spratt will lead a seven-week Lenten Devotional on the Stations of the Cross on Zoom. The Zoom account number is 243 911 4010, no password is required.

The exact origin of the devotional use of The Stations of the Cross is not entirely clear, though it is associated with Christian pilgrimages to Jerusalem in the early Christian centuries.

Those who were able to walk along the path Jesus walked on the way to his crucifixion were deeply moved by this experience. Yet, since the vast majority of Christians were not able to go to Jerusalem, The Way of the Cross enabled them to engage in a mini-pilgrimage of sorts, so they could focus on the key events of Jesus' last day.

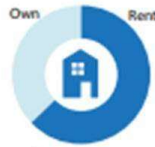

In addition to providing basic needs and emergency services, Cameron is helping to stabilize individuals and families by achieving self-sufficiency, as well as hosting innovative youth and teen programs supporting education and enrichment.

BASIC NEEDS

Meal Program:

- Free Hot Lunch, Mobile and Emergency Food Pantry and Community Garden
- **23,000** healthy meals served, using the **USDA Myplate** model of a balanced diet

- Increased availability to healthy and affordable foods
- Nutrition Education classes

Transportation:

- **250** bus passes provided for transportation to medical appointments

Clothing House:

- "Boutique-like" Shop
- **2,071** families access for hygiene products, toothbrushes, diapers, clean clothing, linens, etc.
- Interview attire provided for job seekers

Work Experience Program: (WEP)

- **RochesterWorks!** places interns at Cameron to learn job skills, particularly around kitchen management and cooking
- Last year, **6 interns** received jobs after Cameron placement

HIGHER LEVEL NEEDS

Social Worker:

- A full-time, bilingual Social Worker, who is also a medical interpreter
- Forms trusting relationships
- Provides connections (including Resource Fairs) to assist with **medical, DSS, housing, mental health, and substance use needs**
- Helps **150** clients annually
- Approximately, **25% of clients** receive connections to healthcare through referrals to primary care physician, health insurance navigation, and/or a mental health or substance abuse provider

Paid staff and volunteers provide vibrant education and enrichment in a safe and supportive environment, bridging the digital divide by providing technology, training, and promoting students' use, and preventing summer slide with seasonal programs.

Youth Program—Kindergarten-6th Grade:

- Up to **50 children** participate
- Primary emphasis on **academic support, homework completion, positive behavior, and conflict resolution**
- Close collaboration with RCSD including shared academic progress reporting
- Equipped with wifi, laptops, and snacks
- At least 30 minutes of physical exercise daily and weekly lessons in the Community Garden, led by Foodlink, which promote healthy living
- **3 hours with us**, culminating with a nightly dinner together

Teen Program—7-12th Grade:

- Up to **50 children** in our brand new, beautiful Teen Center
- Primary emphasis is on **academic support, life skills, field trips, financial literacy, and mentorship**
- Equipped with wifi, laptops, snacks and meals where they can hang with friends
- Bridging the digital divide by providing **technology, training, and promoting students' use**
- Teens drop in for **up to 4 hours** and share a meal together before leaving
