Permits ensure your project complies with the Municipal Zoning Bylaw and the National Building Code. If you are unsure if you require a permit, call the Town Office at 306-547-2810.

## **Elm Tree Pruning Ban**

Once again, the Elm Tree Pruning Ban is in effect from April 1<sup>st</sup> through to August 31<sup>st</sup>, as it is each year, to prevent the spread of Dutch Elm disease. During this time no pruning or removing of Elm trees is permitted within Saskatchewan.

## **Dog Walking**

Please remember to clean up after your pets when going out for a walk to help keep our community clean. Failing to do so is a violation of Bylaw #1-2009.

## **Eco Centre Hours**
