The Hatton Half: When My Love To Christ Grows Weak

We often sing this song in preparation for the Lord's Supper to assist in establishing a proper mindset. However, though the song may be used specifically for that time, that should not be the only time it is sung. That song should be sung, in my opinion, much more. Sadly, there are times in life when our love for Christ may become weaker than it otherwise would be. The reasons for such may be great in number, but the fact remains that situations like this do happen. So, what can we do in combatting this way of thinking?

When my love to Christ grows weak, I need back to the garden. The Garden of Gethsemane was where our Lord's final moments began. It was our Lord's custom to go to the garden to pray (Mat. 26:36; Mark 14:32). It was here that our Lord uttered His famous prayer to "let this cup pass from me: nevertheless not as I will, but as thou wilt" (Mat. 26:39). This was the beginning to the other events that would lead to our Lord's giving His life. At times, we must revisit the things that happened to begin a long, difficult process. It is often in reflecting on these things that items manifest

When my love for man grows weak, I go back to Calvary. Calvary was the conclusion of man's horrible atrocities. From the false trials, keeping Jesus up all night, slaps, mocks and lashings, the night was a bloodbath, for lack of a better term. We often think the crucifixion was the worst part of the ordeal, but often never think about the nature of our Lord's suffering leading to His hanging upon the cross. It was all the events preceding that did the greater amount of damage. The scourging that took place would have been the end to most who fell victim to this torture. Often, the backs of those who took such a beating were left exposing the back of the lungs. It was a truly gruesome undertaking under an absolutely ruthless regime.

Sometimes, we need to place ourselves into the events that occurred in those fateful few hours. It is when our love for Christ and for our fellow man grows weak that we need to crucifixion and records of the events to go back to. It is the hope that something seen in those will help our love for Christ and man to grow much deeper. In so doing, let us not become callused to the events, but build up a deep intimacy with them.
