WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THIS STUDY?

- Care recipient must be 65 years of age or older.
- The care recipient and the caregiver must be available to participate in classes, which are enrolling now. Study and analysis are expected to end December 2019.

DURING THE EIGHT-WEEK STUDY CARE PARTNERS WILL:

- Work with the performing arts to build caregiver resilience and reduce caregiver stress.
